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# **PCB Unveils New Public Art Sculptures**

A new crop of colorful public art sculptures is now in place at locations throughout Panama City Beach.

City Council last August approved SeeLife 2, the second phase of a public arts program begun in early 2021 that initially placed eleven dolphin and sea turtle sculptures at sites across the city. Joining the artwork pieces from that first phase, city officials on June 21 unveiled ten new sculptures — five dolphins and five seahorses — affixed with topical illustrations and painted in bright colors by volunteer citizen artists.

The \$25,000 SeeLife 2 project was financed through a grant from the Panama City Beach Conventions and Visitors Bureau.

A beaming Mayor Mark Sheldon presided over the public unveiling of the sculptures on June 21 in the plaza at city hall as a crowd of several dozen people joined several city councilmen and senior staffers to applaud the artists' work.

"Art enhances public spac-



es," Sheldon said. "These sculptures will be adding more value, adding more art to our community."

Beach spokeswoman Debbie Ingram noted that the artists matched the themes of some of the sculptures with the businesses where they are displayed.

For instance, K-3 students at the A. Gary Walsingham Academy illustrated their seahorse sculpture, "The Whimsical Winder," with images from various STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math) icons including an Edison lightbulb, stars, math symbols and art.

The seahorse is on display at Wonderworks at 9910 Front Beach Road, the entertainment center that exposes young people to a wide variety of science and educational experiences, said teacher Julie DeFelice.

In addition to "The Whimsical Wonder," located at the school at 44 Chip Seal Parkway, the other SeeLife 2 sculptures can be seen at the following locations:

"See Horse," a seahorse sculpture painted by Lee Ann Leonard, is on display at Pier Park on the roundabout on Bluefish Drive near the north side of J.C. Penney;

"For the Love of the Game," a dolphin also created by Ms. DeFelice's students, is on display at Beef O'Brady's sports themed restaurant at 11226 Hutchison Blvd.;

"Majestic Magic," a seahorse painted by artist Jeri Salisbury and friends, is at Majestic Beach Resort, 10901 Front Beach Road;

"Vibransea," a seahorse

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

We have used the tools provided by the county commission to fine violators \$500 for entering the water on double red flags. We don't have the resources or time to cite every single person that enters the water, but we do our absolute best to use it as a deterrent to keep them from entering the water. An arrest is only authorized upon a second offense unless the individual resists law enforcement.

We have been diligently working with the TDC, Commissioners, and other partners to continually improve our response capabilities and messaging to make sure everyone knows the flag conditions. Yet, people are still dying.

Government and law enforcement can only do so much in these situations. Personal responsibility is the only way to ensure that no one else dies. Please make the effort to know the beach flag status and stay completely out of the water during double red flags.

I'm so proud of the men and women of the Bay County Sheriff's Office and partner agencies that are giving their absolute best to save lives. Please be responsible and don't put your life or theirs in danger.

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# **Local Business Expands Into Bay County**

Gulf Coast Shutter and the Overhead Door Company of Northwest Florida (both Dillard companies) together are such a well-known entity, you'd be forgiven for thinking they've been around forever. But it was in 2011, when Wayne Bernheisel acquired Gulf Coast Shutter (founded in 2001) that this local business really became part of the local community. Now, with the acquisition of Quality Gates and Openers in Panama City, they're poised to extend their reach even farther down the Gulf Coast.

Wayne Bernheisel had always wanted his own business, but the path to this end goal wasn't a straight one. It took a stint in the Air Force and corporate jobs with companies like Rolls-Royce and Crane Aerospace & Electronics before he was able to buy Gulf Coast Shutter in 2011. It turned out to be the perfect time for him to combine his love of community with his dream of a self-owned enterprise. "I wanted something that provided me opportunity to be out serving

the community and building relationships, to me that was really important and more fulfilling. Coming from the corporate side, local community was not such a priority during my tenure," explains Bernheisel. For him, Gulf Coast Shutter and the Overhead Door Company of NW Florida offer a way to provide the community with needed products, for security and otherwise, but also much-needed services. Their tagline - Live Life Beautifully Secure - is reflected in a product line that ranges from basic hurricane screens to Colonial and Bahama Shutters with plenty of curb appeal to a variety of eye-catching garage door options.

And though they got their start primarily in residential, they are now a major supplier for commercial as well. Whether they're dealing with a large business or a comparatively small residential project, customer service is paramount. Recently, an older gentleman and his brother came into the showroom and said they needed springs for sheet doors on

their outbuildings. It wasn't a manufacturer that they dealt with, but Bernheisel and his team dug up the information for them and passed it along. It's this kind of community interaction that helps build strong local ties, reinforced by his out-of-office roles whether he's serving in his Niceville church or sitting on both the board of the Destin Chamber and the Apprenticeship Advisory Council for NW Florida State College. He's also been a member of the Destin Rotary Club since 2011 and will be the President-elect for the next term.

The recent merger with Quality Gates and Openers in Panama City under the ownership of Chris Harris allows Bernheisel and his team to extend this community reach well outside of Walton County. Now, they have over 40 employees spread between two locations, one location to cover the Southport to Port St. Joe region and another to service the Valparaiso/Destin area stretching west to Pensacola, as well as everything in between. Additionally, Quality Gates and Openers offers a broad range of services that will nicely complement those of Gulf Coast Shutter and the Overhead Door Company. "We design, we fabricate, we powder coat, we install, and we service automated gates," explains Harris. He rattles off a list of gates that includes (but is not limited to) driveway gates, gates for residential homes, industrial complexes, boardwalk gates, garden gates, pool gates, and pedestrian gates in general. They can also install keypads, card readers, wrist bands - if you can use it to open a gate, Harris is your guy. He's been in the gate business for 16 years, ever since he bumped into a former mentor in the construction industry driving around working on automated gates. Harris had been looking for a new opportunity and the man offered to take him on as a 50/50 partner on the spot. Now, it's


a multi-million dollar business with 15 employees. In addition to offering a range of installations, Harris also offers a 24hour response time for stuck or broken gates, whether or not he installed them. "I don't know anyone around that is reliable doing that," says Harris. "Service is something we pour a lot of effort into." Like Bernheisel though, Harris is also big on community. Every Veteran's Day since 2021, they've hosted a dinner and given a veteran an automated gate that Quality Gates installs for them. But it doesn't stop there - Harris is





also a long-time football coach at Mosley High School, and and he recently joined the Panama City Beach Rotary Club. The company is a participant in both Bay and Walton County Chambers, the Community Association Institute, and the American Fence Association.

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# Know Your Neighbor: Rendy Lovelady

Kenny Chesney, Brad Paisley, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Kid Rock, Thomas Rhett and Miranda Lambert. What do all these artists have in common? They have all taken the stage in Panama City Beach for Gulf Coast Jam. For the past ten years, some of country music's biggest stars have performed in front of crowds of over 30,000 people during Gulf Coast Jam. One of the people most instrumental in bringing "Country to the Coast" for Gulf Coast Jam is Executive Producer and Bay County Resident Rendy Lovelady.

Lovelady, who has been in the music business for almost four decades, got his start at an iconic venue in New Orleans.

"I was born and raised in New Orleans and I actually got my roots starting working for Pace Concerts and Messina Presents. I worked in the Saenger Theater, sweeping floors and pulling cables and doing everything I could possibly do starting my career."

After going to college to play football, Lovelady decided that he wanted to get back to his passion of promoting the music industry.

"I started out as a tour manager that is where my roots came from, working with bands like Van Halen, Motley Crue, and Bon Jovi over the years. I moved to Nashville over thirty years ago with my family and I moved into managing," he explains. "I managed Christian acts, rock acts, country acts, and as I got older I started producing festi-



vals and events like Tennessee River Run and Bama Jam and now Gulf Coast Jam."

Although today, Gulf Coast Jam is synonymous with Panama City Beach as thousands of locals and residents alike pack into Frank Brown Park for great vendors, delicious food and drinks (and of course fantastic country music), a decade ago that was not the case. For Lovelady, bringing Gulf Coast Jam to the "World's Most Beautiful Beaches" was an easy decision.

"I was a part of the group that came in and reinvested in Bama Jam in 2010. By 2012, Mark (Sheldon) and I had partnered up about trying to take Bama Jam to the next level. We had started looking for a place to move Bama Jam and noticed one of our top-selling ticket places was Panama City Beach and the Panhandle. So we came down and met with the Tourist Development Council and Dan Rowe. We presented our vision and honestly, they stepped up to the plate....and the rest is history."

Although there is no denying that Gulf Coast Jam is a favorite event for visitors and locals alike, for Lovelady the road has been a rocky one.

"We've been through two cancellations because of Covid, SandJam being canceled because of Covid, a hurricane canceled Gulf Coast Jam one time. It's been very dicey over the years, but at the same time God has really blessed us beyond what we can ever compare."

For Executive Producer Rendy Lovelady, Bay County was not just a draw as a perfect location for a venue, it became a perfect place to call home as well.

"I finally moved to town and met a lot of the locals and I'm absolutely in love with Panama City Beach people and Destin people. I'm blessed to be able to go to dinner in Destin and see people and they know Gulf Coast Jam. It's my home now, I've put down roots and I'm very content here and Gulf Coast Jam has the potential to be that festival in this area to be around way after I'm gone."

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# Summer's Gettin' Hot and Fish are Biting!

Summer fishing is off to a good start with some really nice Red Snapper coming in, as well as plenty of other species (like King Mackerel) on the charter boats. Headboats always focus on bottom fishing for several types of reef fish; charter boats reef fish but also go after other species. Always a fun experience.

Headboats on Grand Lagoon are headed out daily offering 5, 6, 10, and 12 hr. day trips, as well as the 8 hr. night trip. Be sure to make reservations early to get the trip of your choice. Charter boats can adapt their schedules to yours and offer 6-12 hr trips as well as some 2-day trips. Our State-licensed Guide boats are out catching their limits of snapper too, these days.

As a reminder, federally permitted headboats and charter boats will have their Red Snapper season from June 1 through August 24 at midnight. Red Grouper closes July 20 and Gag Grouper opens September 1 through November 9.

Private anglers with their



own boats are regulated by the FWC, and their Red Snapper season is June 16 through July 31 as well as 3-day weekends in October and November. Why the difference? Private anglers, many are local, fish vacations, when school is out or on weekends. This schedule was preferred over the longer consecutive-day season with no openings in the fall, according to comments made to the FWC by private anglers.

NOAA is mixing it up this year and keeping everyone on their toes. If you want more info, the FISH RULES app is easy to read and seems to keep up with the changes. FWC and NOAA have all the info on their websites, of course, but the app is easier... even for a non-techie like me.

If you are planning an outing on your personal or rented small boat, be sure to refresh your safety skills before you are in a position where you need them. USCG and FWC offer great info. Radios, life jackets, flares, and even a compass can be of great help if you go offshore. (Electronics are great until your



battery is dead or a rogue wave splashes all of it).

There are all sorts of fun family experiences awaiting locals and tourists alike in Grand Lagoon. We have water sports galore, from fishing to cruising. But we also have a variety of locally owned restaurants serving some mighty fine seafood, burgers, and steaks (and, of course, chicken strips and mac n cheese for the kids). Along the Lagoon are several opportunities for enjoying some great local talents

providing music for the whole family.

Capt. Max's Bar & Grill has live music at the Top Deck bar, overlooking Grand Lagoon. Folks watch from their second deck perch as the boats come in and out with their catch of the day. There's a kids' play area out in front with Dip N Dots and Frozen Daquiri Booths. Come watch the boats come in every day between 12 N and 8 p.m. and grab a snack or

dinner!

# Let's Get Growing with Julie:

# What are Your Weeds Telling You?

I cannot begin to guess the number of times over the past eleven years a homeowner has said, "This weed is killing my lawn." Well, not exactly. A weed is a subjective term used to describe a plant out of place. But what if the plant is in the right place, but the gardener's choice is a bad fit?



The number one Florida Friendly Landscaping<sup>TM</sup> principle is "Right Plant, Right Place" which boils down to matching your plants to the location you have rather than trying to manipulate the environment for the plant you want. There are some things we can do to compensate less than ideal environmental conditions, but there are limits to what is reasonable and practical. Sometimes we find that the plant that is flourishing is just better suited for the site than what the homeowner is trying to grow.

Before planting or when troubleshooting an existing landscape issue, you should note the following about the site:

- How many hours of direct sunlight is shining on this site?
- Does the soil drain quickly or remain saturated after rainfall/irrigation?
- What is the pH, and does it match the ideal range for the plant I want to grow?
- Is this area windy? If so, which direction is the wind coming from (this can be critical for marginally hardy plants exposed to North winds as we saw in December of 2022)?
- Is there a high potential of salt exposure by wind, saltwater flooding, fluctuating salt content in reclaimed water, or saltwater intrusion into irrigation wells?

• Are there "indicator weeds" that are trying to tell me important information about this site?

The table below lists some common indicator plants found in landscapes and the conditions they can tolerate.

This table is meant to guide the gardener with site assessment and is not a definitive diagnosis of conditions listed. Let's look at how this information can be useful.

A portion of my Bermudagrass lawn struggles to fill in and every winter I have a lot of annual bluegrass in this spot. Bermudagrass prefers full sun, good drainage, and has moderate fertility needs. Annual bluegrass can tolerate shade, compaction, moist soil, and low fertility. If the bluegrass is thriving and the bermudagrass does not, this tells me that I need to take a closer look at these characteristics and decide between modifying the site or choosing a different plant for that site.

For Fearless Phil, buying the Sea Dragon Pirate Ship has been one of the best decisions as it not only creates memorable experiences for families but also for the larger community.

"I like being from Panama City and I like it when the business becomes a part of that."





# Making Change in Florida's **Second Congressional District**

It has been a vigorous month on Capitol Hill. My staff and I are hard at work representing and fighting for the people of Florida's Second Congressional District.

June began with the House passing the Fiscal Responsibility Act to address the nation's debt

The month progressed with my introduction of the Creating Accountable Respectful Environments (CARE) for Children Act. Going into the foster care system can be difficult for a child and their parents. The transition is even more difficult when there is a shortage of foster care options. The CARE for Children Act seeks to expand foster home options to include cottage-family homes. Cottage

Family homes offer a family-like living environment in a single-family residency with no more than two children per bedroom unless it is in the child's best interest. This bill helps ensure a healthier and more stable environment for children raised in the foster care system.

One thing that comes up regularly in my conversations in the district is the price of prescription drugs. That's why I also introduced the Increasing Transparency in Generic Drug Applications Act.

This bill improves the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's review process for complex generic medications by allowing the agency to inform generic drug sponsors about the differences between their application and the reference product. In



other words, this increases your choices of affordable, quality prescription drugs.

You deserve access to more

safe, generic medications. Branded drugs currently account for 82% of the total drug spend in the U.S. With many households struggling with inflation, the more money we can help patients save, the better.

Finally, we welcomed the 2023 Congressional Art Competition winner for Florida's Second District, Stella Bagby

of Inlet Beach, and her family to Capitol Hill this past month. Stella is a student at the Ohana Institute, and on June 20, we celebrated her with the official hanging of her piece "Florida Beauty Aura" in the United States Capitol. Millions of individuals will view Stella's artwork while visiting the U.S. Capitol, and her art will remain displayed for one calendar year.

### Studio 237 Music Lessons: Mood Music

"Perhaps you recognize that music affects your emotions. When you listen to upbeat songs, you feel good, and listening to sad songs can lower your mood. If you think about it, the notion that tunes impact feelings shouldn't come as a surprise. The word tune, after all, as well as referring to music, relates to

frequency adjustment. Here's how to use tunes to modify your mood.

# Music can make you see things that aren't there.

A study shows that music influences you in more ways than you may imagine. In the study, researchers showed people smileys and asked them to identify sad or happy faces while music played. Sad songs made them see the smileys as unhappy, while cheerful songs had the opposite effect. The subjects saw merry faces when they heard upbeat music. It was astonishing they saw things that weren't there. It means music changed what they perceived in the environment.

# So, what are the implications of this study for you?

You might want to think about the results and how the findings play out in your life. You can use them to your advantage. If you are in a negative mood but want to improve your outlook, you can play joyful songs. When you want a balanced mindset, though, background tunes might skew your perception. Turning them off during a difficult conversation, for example, may boost clarity.

### How long you listen to music matters.

Another study shows it takes thirteen minutes of slow tempo, classical music to aid focus, and nine minutes of uplifting music to increase happiness. Relaxing music eases stress, improves sleep, and boosts peacefulness in thirteen minutes. It seems that how long you listen to music matters if you want to change your state of mind and adopt its emotional frequency. So, persevere for more than a few minutes when you hope to change your mood.

### Your heart follows the beats.


The number of beats in a rhythm makes all the difference. According to Lyz Cooper, who collaborated with Marconi Union to create 'Weightless,' a soothing track, listeners' heart-beats fall into rhythm with the music they hear. The BPM, or beats per minute, affects you on a physical and emotional level.

To change your mood, choose music with a tempo to match the energy you want to feel. Note whether it lifts, relaxes, or saddens you. Don't discount sad music, though. Many people swear it helps them release heartache. It's possible unhappy music resonates with despairing individuals and helps them let go of emotions.

Another theory suggests it might support the production of prolactin, a hormone that aids consolation and calm. So, when you're sad, listening to music that pulls on the heartstrings may help. If it doesn't, switch to tunes with different tempos and find one that does.

Music is a powerful tool when used with care. It can alter your perception of life, making it sunnier, or help you release sadness. Notice how tunes affect you, and you can employ them to improve your wellbeing.

# Review: Blu Poolside Bar & Grill at Embassy Suites

A recent visit to Blu Poolside Bar & Grill inside the new Embassy Suites by Hilton Panama City Beach was a fascinating experience and an evening to behold. The food and beverages were all top-notch, which I will describe shortly, but it was the atmosphere and service at the Embassy Suites that stole our hearts. My husband and I were met by Executive Chef Scott Plumley and Director of Sales & Marketing Barbara Lita, then seated by Michelle, who would serve us throughout the evening, alongside Liz. From the first moment we knew we were in good hands and were treated like royalty (albeit in a light and breezy, not-so-formal fashion!). Everyone at Embassy Suites has a big, genuine smile, and the happy energy trickles throughout the whole establishment. Our friends Roy and Kandi Woods (Kandi of the Florida Restaurant & Lodging Association) joined us, as well as General Manager Mike Chouri and Director of Finance Carol Zukosky. It was a celebration of



the start of summer, friendship, and good food!

Michelle started us out with a cocktail, and Blu has a long list of delicious concoctions. I decided to try the Panama Pear Mojito, a lovely rum with prickly pear puree, lime juice, agave, and mint. This cool elixir was minty and crisp. Jimy ordered his standard, an Old Fashion, with bourbon, maple syrup and bitters. "Smooth and sleek," he commented. The Don't Slip (tequila, grapefruit, and pear juice) and Piney Mimosa (prosecco and pineapple vodka with orange and lemon juice) are future indulgences on my list. Blu also has a full wine list and serves

beers, seltzers, and spirited frozen drinks.

This establishment serves lunch and dinner daily, and with its central location and proximity to so many businesses, Blu is becoming the "It" meeting spot for business lunches and dinners, friend meetups, and social gatherings by the locals. Michelle

started bringing out a succession of dishes from the Sharables, Hot Hands and Entrée menus. The stunning Emerald Tuna Crunch salad got our attention with its pepper-crusted, seared ahi tuna strips laid over baby greens, fresh mango, avocado, applewood smoked bacon, and topped with almonds, crispy wontons, and fried goat cheese with a splash of mango sesame vinaigrette. It was an aesthetic fusion of tastes, textures and temperatures, and that goat cheese was screaming with flavor! Now, our moms always claimed that a colorful plate is the most nutritious plate, and the Lemon and Herb Seared Salmon served alongside a sticky rice pilaf (reminiscent of veggie risotto) and freshly steamed, al dente broccolini is the epitome of this declaration. The salmon was prepared in a carrot-ginger butter and soy glaze, and the entire dish was emblazoned with bold, bright, colors.


Then Michelle brought the powerhouse of the feast, Filet Mignon ladled in a luscious thick gravy with a toss of micro greens atop. The meat was a thick cut of the most mouth-watering, tender filet I've had, and

this flamboyant offering looked as good as it tasted, served with smashed potatoes and a veggie medley of red & green cherry tomatoes, red & green bell peppers, yellow squash, asparagus, and onions. The men enjoyed Blu's Jumbo Wings, crispy fried and smoked in a variety of flavors to choose from: buffalo, brown sugar-chipotle, sweet chili, spicy bbq, hot honey, and parmesan rub. I asked how they liked them... and my answer was the empty plates. A favorite "Hot Hands" plate was the Grouper Tacos... grilled and topped with kale coleslaw, avocado aioli, salsa verde, and roasted corn & black bean salsa. So many flavor sensations! Carol enjoyed what I consider to be the most unique dishes on the menu (and I will return to try this), the Roasted Cauliflower tossed in whipped ricotta and roasted chile paste, sprinkled with smoked almonds over an edamame puree.

But the best was saved for last. I didn't know how we could possibly surpass this extraordinary meal, but Michelle brought out Blu's three desserts (and I honestly can't choose which one I like the best, so you'll just have to come in, try them all, and let me know!): the Sticky Toffee Bread Pudding with a salted caramel dip, Key Lime Cheesecake with a berry coulis, and Chocolate Chess Pie with Chantilly cream. The latter was a rich, dense, fudge torte that I had not previously encountered in this area.

Let me add a few words about the wonderful team at Blu Poolside Bar & Grill. Mike Chouri, General Manager, has many years of experience in leading hotel and resort operations for many Hiltons, Marriott's and IHG branded hotels including Hilton Boston Woburn, Nickelodeon Orlando, Westin Las Vegas, the Sheraton and The Westin Tysons corner, Hilton Sandestin, and Hilton Alexandria Old Town. ### Double cleanse your skin at night.



Couples who play together, stay together, but that doesn't mean you should treat your marriage like a game. If you treat your marriage like a game, you'll get played and lose every

Couples who "play together" by engaging in fun, novel activities grow closer to each other, experience more positive emotions toward each other and their relationship and, as a result, are happier and want to stay together.

Three Reasons Why Playing Together Helps You Stay Together

First, playing together in novel and arousing activities keeps you (and your spouse) from getting bored and your relationship from becoming a boring rou-

Boredom sacks the current

joy out of your relationship and, if not addressed, leads to increasing dissatisfaction over time, the temptation to seek excitement outside the relationship, and/or ultimately the "we've just grown apart" explanation for divorce.

Second, playing together also helps you and your spouse connect the good feelings you experience during the activity to your overall relationship.

Third, participating in novel and arousing activities makes people feel happier in general, and when you are a happier person, you are more likely to be a happy partner and extend that positive emotion to your marriage and spouse.

How far do you have to go to keep you and your spouse out of a boring routine?

Off the couch, maybe. But not that far.

Go for a bike ride. Throw a football around. Take a walk on the beach or a canoe ride. Try a stand-up paddle board. A new restaurant. Get to know other couples - new friends you make together.

Remember, marriage is not a game. Both husband and wife are on the same side.

So be sure you aren't keeping score. If your wife "wins" because you agree to try some-



thing new that she recommended, you both win.

And, if your husband "wins" because you agree to try something new that he likes, you also both win.

Here's a common example for football season (just remember, the point of the story is gender neutral).

If your husband really enjoys watching college football, learn to like it, too, rather than pout and try to make him feel guilty. (You might have to pretend at first). This will add a new activity for you to enjoy together.

In turn, he will naturally connect the fun he has watching the activities involve sex?

Sure. But you are unlikely to be any good at sex play, if you aren't fully engaged with each other out of the bedroom. And, if you suggest novel sex before you've shown a willingness to "get off the couch" your effort will backfire. First things first.

If you are starting to feel bored in your marriage, share this article with your spouse and talk about ways you can add some new activities or people to your life. Discuss how the positive feelings you get from these new experiences will help you grow closer again, increase your relationship satisfaction, and decrease the likelihood that you will "grow apart" (or be tempted to find excitement elsewhere).

Pick a new activity and begin to work it out. If your spouse won't go along at first, try learning to like something your spouse already enjoys so you can do it together. Then, try to add something novel to you both.

# Be a Superhero this Summer!

Summer has officially arrived at Panama City Beach (PCB), Florida! All outdoor activities are in full swing in backyards and recreational parks. A positive energetic population explosion of residents and visitors are enjoying a variety of different outdoor activities, ball games, concerts, day camps, fishing, barbecues, and family reunions. Everyone patiently and anxiously awaited an entire year for the summertime festivities to begin! Each person enjoys the PCB great outdoor space except when the mosquitoes arrive as unwanted guests.

How can you be a superhero to protect yourself, family, and friends from this tiny foe that tries to suck all the outdoor fun away? Be a PCB Superhero and "Fight the Bite!" Please read on and follow these simple steps to enhance your outdoor fun.

All superheroes have a special protective force field. You have one at your fingertips too. Al-

ways, remember before heading outdoors, to put on the invisible protective shield of insect repellent to protect yourself against the bite of the female mosquito. Repellents are safe and effective when used correctly following the label instructions. You have an array of repellent choices available. To correctly choose a repellent, make certain it is both approved and registered by the Environmental Protective Agency (EPA) and has one of the following active ingredients. DEET, Picaridin, IR3535, Oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE) or Para-menthane-diol (PMD). Re-application of insect repellent is key for proper protection. Remember, the lower the percentage of the active ingredient, the more frequently you will need to re-apply it. Personal protection begins with you!

Take heed to the important phrase, William Shakespeare wrote in his famous play Julius Caesar; "Timing is everything." The statement is also true when avoiding mosquitoes. After a day's worth of fun in the sun, everyone enjoys relaxing in the re-




freshing PCB summer evenings. Unfortunately, peak mosquito activity is during these pleasant dusk (and dawn) hours too. Before heading back outdoors for the evening to embrace the outdoor nightlife, reapply your protective repellent shield or if possible, limit your outdoor activities at dawn and dusk. A newer item on the market to deter mosquitoes from biting is a portable battery-operated mosquito-repellent lantern. This lantern safely creates a barrier between you and mosquitoes. It works by thermally heating up an EPA-approved repellent and broadcasting it by a fan so you can relax poolside or enjoy your other favorite outdoor activities. Each mosquito lantern creates an environmentally friendly 15-foot protective zone that can last up to 12 hours. Citronella candles still work (4 candles per 50-foot area). Other effective options are mosquito coils or safely using an oscillating fan.

Be a proactive superhero! Lower mosquito population numbers by eliminating potential mosquito breeding sites. Weekly, check your business or private property for possible standing water locations. Common mosquito breeding areas are bird baths, boats, buckets, canoes, coolers, fountains, kayaks, plant saucers, chemically imbalanced pools/hot tubs, trash cans, toys, watering cans, wheelbarrows, or anything else that can hold water for an extended period. Seventy-Five percent of the mosquito life cycle is in the water apart from the adult stage. Therefore, water is essential to its life cycle. Remember, "Drain or the mosquitoes will remain!" It only takes 7 to 10 days from the egg stage to the adult mosquito. By eliminating these locations, you are also preventing the possible spread of mosquito-borne disease.

If the above mosquito prevention suggestions have not resolved your mosquito concerns, contact PCB's experts Beach Mosquito Control District (BMCD) for relief. The service BMCD offers to residents and visitors is paid for by a local ad-valorem tax. We encourage both residents and visitors to place a service request by contacting the district directly at (850) 233-5030 or to submit a service request on our website www.pcbeachmosquito.org. We offer same-day inspections and environmentally friendly solutions during our normal business hours of operation, Monday - Friday 6:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.



# Become a Florida Resident in One Trip



The number of residents in Bay County continues to increase with many moving to Florida for the first time. If you have recently moved to Bay County from a different area of the country, we want to welcome you to our beautiful county and offer assistance as you transition to becoming a Florida resident. Here are some things you need to know before visiting our office to obtain your Florida Driver License/Identification Card or to register and tag your vehicles. Follow these directions and you should be able to get everything accomplished in one trip!

# Make Sure You Have the Required Documents to Complete Your Transactions.

To register your out-of-state vehicles in Florida, please bring the following:

- Out-of-State Title and Registration. If the vehicle has a lien on it, please have your lienholder information available (Name, Address, Phone Number, Fax Number) as we will have to send a request to the lienholder before we can title and register the vehicle in Florida.
- All vehicle owners on title should be present with photo identification. If one of the owners cannot be present, a Power of Attorney should be completed for that individual.
- Proof of Florida Insurance on the vehicle. Call your insurance company and ask them to switch you to a Florida policy.
- Bring the vehicle with you. A VIN inspection will need to be done at our office.
- Driver License/ ID Card: Florida is a Real ID State, which requires residents to provide specific documents to prove their identity when applying for



a driver license or identification card. If you're a U.S. citizen, you'll need to bring the following original documents with you to your appointment, we cannot accept photocopies of these documents.

- State Certified Birth Certificate or Valid U.S. Passport
- Two pieces of mail with your current name and current address
- Social Security Card or number
- If your name has changed since birth, please bring proof of every legal name change document (certified marriage license, court order, etc.).



A New Resident Appointment can be set up at BayTax-Collector.com. Scheduling an appointment provides us the ability to take care of driver license and vehicle registrations for new residents in one visit.



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# Insights for Investors:

# Stocks, Real Estate and Treasuries Over Time

A review of the long-term return of stocks versus U.S. Treasuries reveals that a small number of stocks have outperformed US Treasuries and inflation going back all the way to 1926. That result can leave an investor wondering if stocks make sense to invest in at all. The same can be said for real estate as well.

The long-term return for stocks is 8 percent (without reinvesting dividends) and real estate is closer to 4 percent (not considering income). That is according to Peter Earle, an economist at the American Institute of Economic Research. That puts those two classes ahead of Treasuries and inflation, which are both closer to 5 percent and 3 percent over the same time frame. A review of gold also reveals that it has consistently underperformed stocks, as a group, as well. That leaves the investor wondering that if stocks offer the greatest potential for wealth accumulation, where might an investor put his money?

If someone is fortunate enough to have found the right stock, in the right sector at the right time, that probably resulted in outsized gains. Most investors who have accumulated their wealth with equities have done so through the buying and holding of businesses, represented by their stocks, over long periods of time. That also means sticking with a strategy until your needs, objectives, timeframe or comfort level change. We believe that investors can work toward their goals by investing in the American economy (and across the world in some cases) and across all its industries and to be careful not to over allocate to any one area.



What about trends and momentum? Many investors have seen the extraordinary return of a relatively small number of


