## **Christmas at The Wesley House**

The year 2024 marks Walton County's bicentennial, and one fine way to commemorate this is with a visit to the Christmas celebration at the stately Wesley House in Eden Gardens State Park. This annual event has become a welcome herald of both the holiday season and Walton County's rich history. While the end of the year is a hectic time for many, this holiday celebration offers the opportunity to experience a treasured part of our community's past and present.

Wesley House's legacy is long. Initially built as a Victorian-style home in 1897, it was later converted to Antebellum. It was the home of the Wesley Family, including nine children, and their business was lumber. There were three mills located in the Tucker Bayou which adjoins the park. Mrs. Wesley was the last of the family to occupy the house, dying in 1953. Over the next ten years, the house fell into ruin. Neighborhood children would play in the rooms, and even goats took up residence!

In 1963, Ms. Lois Max-

\$12,500 for 10.5 acres and then proceeded to change the house to an Antebellum style, furnishing the rooms with valuable antiques, and spending over a million dollars on the restoration. Ms. Maxon did not get to live in her Eden for long due to poor health, but was generous enough to leave the house and grounds to the State of Florida. That would approve of our efforts to commemorate this most extraordinary gift by coming together as a community each year around the holiday to celebrate.

The Wesley House will be decorated and ready for guided tours by through Monday, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on an hourly basis. ## **New Beach Homes Have Unique Design**

When Wesley DeFoor prepared to develop a new vacation housing project on Front Beach Road last year, he opted to try something radically different.

With nearly a quarter-century of real estate experience in Florida and Georgia, De-Foor could easily have erected a four-story condominium cube on the empty 3/4-acre tract on the north side of the 17000 block of Front Beach Road just east of the Splash Beach Resort. Under its Commercial High-Density zoning, the property could accommodate up to 33 condo units.

Instead, DeFoor told PCB Life, he turned to architect Wade R. Squires and said, "Design me ten single-family dwellings on this [property] that make sense." Currently practicing in his hometown of Mt. Vernon, Iowa, Squires is no stranger to the Florida Panhandle. He spent seven years in Walton County designing resort homes and condominiums in high-end communities including Seaside, Watercolor and Rosemary Beach.

Nine months after the project broke ground last January, the Villas at Laguna Beach development is presenting a stark new silhouette compared with the typical cubic beach houses and condos along the Gulf beachfront.

Each of the ten houses consists of a four-story structure measuring only 25 feet wide and 37 feet deep, but rising forty-five



feet up. The ground, second and third floors contain five full bedrooms and baths, with a full kitchen, dining room and living room on the fourth floor. In addition, the flat roof features a 25 by 25-square foot deck with a covered bar and wide-screen TV. A large media room is on the ground floor.

Other features include a dumbwaiter elevator (for lifting luggage and food supplies) in nine of the ten units, with a full elevator in the tenth to accommodate visitors with limited mobility. Each house will have a 10 x 10-foot "plunge pool," plus two parking spaces.

Each house will accommodate up to ten people at a time, DeFoor added.

Panama City Beach planning director Mel Leonard said De-Foor's approach to a relatively





small tract is "kind of unique ... going as high as they can to make sure they have enough space for parking" required under the zoning law. "They are well below the [maximum allowed] density for that site," he said.

"This is a really unique design," DeFoor agreed. "He [Squires] utilized every square foot."

DeFoor said the homes will be utilized as short-term vacation rentals, with a local property management firm supervising the complex. Rental rates will be commensurate with similar-sized properties in the area, he said.

The Villas at Laguna Beach is scheduled for opening next March.

**Native Sunflowers**

Bales of hay, pumpkins, college football, and sunflowers are all iconic signs of fall. It is hard to not be awed by rows of giant sunflowers, but few yards have the space for that type of showstopping display. Luckily, we have more native sunflower options that are great for low maintenance Florida land-

#### scapes with limited space!

Two of my favorite native plants are in the same genus as the Annual Sunflower (their showy cousin mentioned above) and will fit tough conditions in your garden. The first is beach sunflower and the second one is swamp sunflower – already sounding pretty Florida, right?

#### Beach Sunflower (Helianthus debilis)

As the name implies, beach sunflower is perfectly suited to landscapes that are on or close to the Gulf of Mexico or saltwater bays. They love well-drained sandy soil and are tolerant of salt spray and wind. This plant's growth habit is a little hard to define; most publications list it as a groundcover, but it does have some upright growth, so don't let that category fool you. In Northwest Florida, beach sunflower grows to a height of 3-4

feet and spreads the same distance. This informal sprawling habit is great on slopes or in an informal landscape bed. Beach sunflower will spread by underground runners and seed but is easy to thin out if it outgrows the intended area. Plant in full sun for the most prolific flowering which occurs throughout the spring and summer.

#### Swamp Sunflower (Helianthus angustifolius)

Swamp sunflower is one of those plants that you might forget you have because most of the year it is comprised of simple green foliage. Suddenly in late summer it sends up tall branching stalks full of 2- to 3-inch-wide bright yellow flowers. Found naturally along streambanks and in areas prone to flooding, swamp sunflower can tolerate wet soil that alternates with dry conditions. Although it tolerates some shade, for best flowering lo-

cate in full sun. In full bloom, this perennial reaches 6 feet tall, making it perfect for adding a punch of color to the back of flower beds or along fences lines when little else is blooming. Swamp sunflower forms clumps that can be easily divided and shared with friends and family or you can let it fill in a bare area.

## Know Your Neighbor: Jennifer Vigil

Panama City, the city where life sets sail, is home to worldclass fishing, boating, hiking, and sightseeing, and a four-season paradise for anyone who enjoys the water. As president and CEO of Destination Panama City, Jennifer Vigil's job is to showcase all that Panama City has to offer. For Vigil, this is less of a job and more of a passion.

Less than a decade ago, Destination Panama City as a marketing organization did not exist. The tourist organization was only formed in 2015, and Vigil was selected to develop strategies designed to drive tourism to the area. With an MA in public administration, Vigil originally had no intention of working in the tourism industry. "I always say that I affectionally started on the dark side, remembers Vigil. "I thought that I wanted to be a City Manager. I made it all the way up to the City Clerk. I had basically reached the pinnacle of what I wanted to reach. I backed away from a regular

government job and did a bunch of freelance work, and ended up being offered a position at Visit South Walton as the Director of Administration which was incredible. Visit South Walton is one of the top ten destination organizations in the state of Florida so the opportunity to come into the industry at one of the top ten was pretty fabulous."

As the Director of Administration for Visit South Walton, Vigil realized that her background made her uniquely suited to driving tourism to the area by studying

[the] behavioral patterns of visitors. "I think a lot of people think that tourism is just making commercials and ads," says Vigil. "With tourism, the personal satisfaction I get out of it is the science behind it. Tourism is



complete behavior analysis. It is finding out who is coming, how they are spending money, how they are learning out about us and really using technology, especially with this generation."

When the City of Panama City formed the brand-new destination marketing organization, Vigil knew it would be a challenge worth taking on. "I was always up for a challenge, and I couldn't think of anything more exciting than building a destination marketing organization from the ground up. For me there always has to be a little bit of a challenge... I am always a proponent of growth," she explains.

However, building Destination Panama City as a world-class destination organization would be met with numerous challenges such as Hurricane Michael and the COVID-19 pandemic. For Vigil, each challenge would be an

opportunity to move forward. "I think in life there is no choice but to keep putting one's foot in front of the other. You wake up every day with the opportunity to decide whether to do that in a positive or negative way. The biggest hurt somebody can do to themselves is not moving forward. My dad's favorite thing to tell us was that we had to live exceptional lives, not acceptable lives."

Today, Destination Panama City has evolved and cemented itself as a cutting-edge destination marketing organization, bringing in thousands of visitors from all over for the fishing, shopping, and dining, but for Vigil, it's the satisfaction of showcasing the importance of tourism that drives her.

In my hazy childhood recollections, there's one Christmas memory that is a little more clear than the others. It was 1980, and five-year-old me had requested what, in my mind, was quite an unachievable Christmas list: a dollhouse with tiny furniture, pink ballet shoes with a fancy carrying case (Barbie if possible), and a Kermit the Frog plush with long velcro arms. Each one of these items in itself was a lofty hope, a faraway dream that perhaps with enough nice behavior might materialize on Christmas morning. I went to sleep on that eve with visions of Kermit dancing in my head, maybe even wearing those pink ballet shoes with the tiny elastic bows at the top. Never in my wildest dreams did I think that all three of those



gifts-and more-were waiting for me the next morning: the pink ballet shoes and vinyl case that I know my Mom had to drive to Fort Walton to find, the Kermit plush and the sweet, two story dollhouse that my Dad had been building in secret for the past month. It was joy upon joy, and I remember spending hours that day and the days afterwards playing with each gift to my heart's content. I even brought **Gifts** my pink ballet shoes for show

and tell on that first school day back from Christmas break.

The gifts I treasure now are more intangible, and one of the greatest gifts I receive as an adult is realization. The most dynamic illustration of this is in Dickens' A Christmas Carol. A timely visit from those Three Spirits is just the terrifying realization that Scrooge needs to turn his life around. What feels like a nightmarish inventory of his life becomes the Christmas gift that he didn't know he needed. The realization that the most wonderful parts of life don't carry a price tag, that time with your family and friends is more precious than gold, and that life is short and each moment is a gift in itself. One of the gifts of becoming older and wiser is that we often come to these realizations through the spirits of experience and circumstance, which

hopefully land more gently than Scrooge's visitations.

When I think back upon that glorious Christmas morning full of so many beautiful things, it's not the pink ballet shoes or the dollhouse that I remember the most. It's the feeling that I was special and loved and important to my family. That feeling is why we give gifts to the people we love, and put so much care and effort into choosing and wrapping and situating it just so under the tree. Once we come to this gift of realization, we understand, just as Scrooge does, that "It is more blessed to give than to receive."

My grown up Christmas list now looks much more like the eponymous song, with wishes like world peace, kindness and unity. It feels like any wish is possible during the holiday season when the air becomes electric with that almost textured magical quality. If I was to define that feeling I would say it comes from all of us being a little more generous and a little more hopeful.

It's the feeling I know you'll have when you come to see any of our holiday shows at Emerald Coast Theatre Company this season. In addition to A Christmas Carol, our talented Junior Company teens are performing Yes, Virginia, There is a Santa Claus. ## ISO: PCB's Best Burger

Hamburgers may well be considered America's favorite food, but the origins of the hamburger are fuzzy at best.

The Germans claim it started in Hamburg (hence the name, hamburger), influenced in turn by 12th century Mongolians' steak tartare. In the 19th century, beef from German Hamburg cows was minced and combined with garlic, onions, salt and pepper, then formed into patties (without bread or a bun) to make Hamburg steaks. Given the quality of Hamburg beef, these early burgers were considered gourmet and were pricey. When German immigrants arrived in New York and Chicago, many opened restaurants and featured the Hamburg steak, an Americanized version of the German offering.

Fletcher Davis claims to have invented the hamburger, putting ground beef between two pieces of Texas Toast when one of his customers was in too much of a hurry to sit down for a meal. The customer walked away with his hamburger steak and seemed so content that "Old Dave" offered his new carryout meal as a staple menu item at the end of 1880 in Athens, Texas.

The Library of Congress credits Danish immigrant Louis Lassen of Louis' Lunch, a small lunch wagon in New Haven, Connecticut, with selling the first hamburger and steak sandwich in the U.S. in 1895.

## Restaurant Review: Captain Anderson's

Our recent evening at Capt. Anderson's Restaurant & Waterfront Market was spectacular! But then again, I honestly can't remember a time when a visit to Capt. A's wasn't. I've dined and attended various functions at this revered establishment many times since first encountering Panama City Beach, Florida in 1982 as a student. And on each visit the food, service, and ambiance has been consistently outstanding.

Back in 1967, Capt. Anderson's was a small eatery serving breakfast and classic Gulf Coast fare, catering heavily to the local fisherman with bagged lunches to take out on the boats with them. Through the years it has slowly expanded, winning the loyalty of millions of customers and friends along the way. The menu now offers a substantial collection of seafood, steaks, and house classics (there are so many "Classics" that the fifth edition of the Capt. Anderson's Cookbook, "Captain's Classics," is now available), gluten-free items, a children's menu, desserts, cocktails, specialty drinks, after dinner drinks, domestic and imported beers, and the massive (and I do mean massive) Captain's Cellar Wine List. Four levels of Wine Club membership are available: Capt.'s Cellar, Grand Cuvée, Private Reserve, and Admiral's Locker. (Go to captanderson. com/wine/wine-club.htm for Wine Club details.) The restaurant's space has grown to 725 seats with two private rooms, the Flying Fish Lounge, and a gift store that sells Capt. Anderson's House Seasoning, Capt. Anderson's Greek Dressing, and fresh seafood, among many other things. Capt. Anderson's

currently employs a 177-member staff with the average length of employment exceeding 25 years. This landmark restaurant even started a local tradition years ago, of "Dining early and watching the fishing fleets unload their catch."

Capt. Anderson's has won numerous esteemed awards through the years, including Southern Living's #1 Seafood Restaurant, Wine Spectator's 'Best Of' Award of Excellence, Restaurants & Institutions' America's Top 50, the Travel Channel's Best Seafood Restaurant, and Florida Trend's Hall of Fame & Golden Spoon (the highest honor Florida Trend can bestow upon a Florida restaurant).

My recent visit to Capt. Anderson's was quite different from all the other visits. That evening we had the opportunity to dine with one of the family members, Anna Patronis Moon, who shared some of Capt. Anderson's background and history as well as a few great behindthe-scenes secrets with us. Like, What's a great appetizer? For starters, Anna recommended the Sesame Crusted Ahi Tuna.

Fresh, rare ahi tuna medallions, encrusted in crunchy, toasted sesame arrived in a beautiful lineup accompanied by wasabi, fresh ginger, soy and the specially imported Terry Ho's Yum Yum sauce. A basket of warm Rice Rolls - our favorite - arrived, and Anna explained what makes them so lovely. Before baking, the yeast rolls are dipped in rice flour, which gives the top of this soft roll a wonderful crackling sensation when bitten into.

Along with the bread, most entrees come with a soup of the day or salad, potato or veggie, and a dish of warm, homemade hush puppies always makes its way to the table. Wine recommendations for many of the dishes adds a nice touch. "May we suggest a bottle of Beringer Luminus Oak Knoll Chardonnay, Napa Valley, with the fresh seafood selections? May we suggest a bottle of Lanson Brut Black Label Champagne with the fried seafood selections, or a bottle of Somona-Cutrer, RRV Chardonnay with any of the pasta dishes?"

A round of Greek Salads arrived at the table, large bowls filled to the rim with fresh, cold, crisp iceberg lettuce (just





the way I like it), ripe and juicy, thick-sliced tomatoes, Greek ripe olives, Salonica peppers and Feta cheese. The "Famous Greek Dressing" was savory and delicious (Anna told us all salad dressings are made daily from scratch). My son enjoyed the evening's featured soup, Chicken Noodle, also homemade from scratch with lovely, delicate noodles in a thick, rich broth. And then the entrees. Anna shared that the two most popular items on the menu are the Seafood Platter, which my husband ordered, broiled, and the Greek Style Grouper Imperial, which I ordered. (During the summer months, the most-ordered item is the Jumbo Fried Gulf Shrimp.)



The seafood platter included shrimp, scallops, fresh grouper, and fried stuffed deviled crab. Everything looked ridiculously fresh and smelled heavenly. And that deviled crab... Anna

told us the secret recipe: shredded blue crab blended with onions, scallions, red and green peppers, relish, and Ritz crackers, all stuffed into a crab shell and cooked. My Grouper Imperial was prepared on an open hearth and charcoal broiled, served with lemon butter, olive oil, chopped spring onions and parsley. Perfectly grilled, tender fish drenched with an out-ofthis world Imperial sauce with large chunks of tender lump crab meat. Our son had the Grilled Churrasco Steak, which was tender, juicy, and perfectly cooked. Anna ordered an offthe-menu secret - the Churrasco steak topped with lump blue crab meat drenched in a creamy, sweet she-crab sauce. The evening's featured vegetable was broccoli... fresh and perfectly cooked al dente, then lightly tossed in seasonings. Our giant baked potatoes' skins were brushed with butter and sea salt, making the exterior a rich, textural delight.

And after all of that, was there any room for dessert? You bet there was! We all sampled the Peanut Butter Pie - a creamy, peanut-buttery concoction in a graham cracker crust (as Anna put it, "Like Reece's Cups on Steroids"), and the Key Lime Pie, a cool, silky sensation of tart citrus in a graham cracker crust. All desserts are made in house, from scratch, daily, as with just about everything.

## **Practicing Gratitude Leads to Happier Marriages**

In this season of Thanksgiving most of us become more intentional about practicing gratitude. We ought to do this all year long, however, because feeling and expressing gratefulness makes us happier and more resilient, improves our relationships, and even boosts our psychological and physical health.

Focusing more on gratitude in your marriage also has positive effects. Couples who practice gratitude together have happier marriages than those who do not practice gratitude. Research shows that couples who mutually express gratitude to each other strengthen their relationship, enhance the levels of perceived intimacy and mutual care, reinforce their sense of belonging, and bolster their levels of marital satisfaction. Conversely, people who initiate divorce often do so because their spouse is overly critical, takes their contributions to their marriage and homelife for granted, and doesn't seem to value who they are as a person, outside of the tasks they perform in the relationship.

You and your partner can protect your marriage from this type of erosion by practicing reciprocal expressions of gratitude.

Look for reasons to say "thank you". Pay attention to the contributions your partner makes to your daily routine such as cooking, making the bed, paying the bills, grocery shopping, loading the dishwasher, house cleaning, laundry, yard work, gassing up the car, and all the other little favors that make your day easier.

Stop taking these contributions for granted and instead acknowledge, value, and appreciate your partner's role in making your life together work well. It's as easy as saying "thank you" sincerely and frequently.

Show that you appreciate who your partner is to you, not just what your partner does for you. Compliments are meaningful when they focus on behaviors and even more meaningful when they highlight the receiver's core values. So, of course,



it is important to be thankful for your partner's hard work and acts of service to your relationship, but it is even more important to praise your partner's virtues.

Is your partner smart, well-organized, a good storyteller, patient, empathetic, honest, funny, a good friend? Pay attention to how your partner lives out important values and express appreciation for the kind of person your partner is to you and others.

Avoid public criticism and give public praise. One of the fundamental rules in relationship communication is to never criticize your partner in public. To do so is disrespectful, embarrasses and demoralizes your partner, and erodes relational trust, intimacy, and satisfaction.

Praising your partner in public has the opposite effect.

Expressing appreciation for your partner publicly shows respect and pride, and will make your partner feel appreciated, important, and loved. As a happy by-product, your partner will feel enhanced warmth toward you and your relationship.

So, take advantage of opportunities to thank or congratulate your partner in front of your children, extended family, and friends. You might even create a social media post showing your partner's good qualities or sharing news of your partner's

success. Act grateful and show appreciation every day. Do small things often, rather than just isolated grand gestures. These small loving actions speak louder than words when it comes to making your partner feel loved and appreciated.

Bring your partner a cup of coffee. Make her favorite meal. Send a text message of encouragement when you know your partner has a presentation, an important meeting, or a long day. Send heart emojis when you text the grocery list. Draw a heart on a post-it and leave it on your partner's windshield or stick it on the bathroom mirror. Look for ways to do little favors for your partner every day.

Small, from-the-heart expressions of love and support send consistently authentic messages of love and appreciation and so they mean much more than a once-a-year candlelit dinner or perfunctory bouquet of roses on special occasions

These four approaches to practicing gratitude will help you and your partner avoid taking each other for granted and keep you on a satisfying relationship path. So, as you begin the season of Thanksgiving this year, why not incorporate them into your holiday preparations. If you do, you'll more likely experience the true measure of Thanksgiving.

test, this break up, this illness... then you will be happy. People talk about happiness as though it's dependent on someone or something external. I'll be happy when I get the recognition I deserve, when my kids start listening, when my partner does the work to understand me, when others agree with me. With all of these happiness narratives swirling, you can feel discouraged and hopeless that happiness will ever be more than brief moments of relief from stress that exists beyond your control.

What if you could shift the happiness narrative? What if happiness is not something to chase or pursue? What if happiness is something to practice? What if happiness can have internal origin instead of you waiting for all of the circumstances to line up perfectly? What if

5 Ways to Begin Practicing Happiness

**1-Acknowledge your current reality honestly.** Not everything feels good, light and happy. Acknowledge what feels good right now. Acknowledge what feels hard right now. Acknowledge feeling hurt, excited, jealous, sad, inspired, fearful, etc. Give space to all of your feelings and remind yourself feelings are normal and they guide your attention to important insight even when they are hard.

**2-Step outside black and white thinking.** Everything is not either wonderful or terrible. You are capable of holding the tension of some things in your life feeling hard while some things are going well. You don't have to pretend the hard things aren't hard. You also don't have to exclusively focus on the negative. You can give meaningful attention to what is good even in the face of the hard.

**3-Reserve space for daily gratitude.** Try setting reminders in your phone throughout the day to focus on 3-5 things you appreciate. Anything counts including spiritual things, relationships, material things, weather, feelings, books, shows, positive test results, a laugh, etc. Try inverting your frustrations with gratitude. Stuck in traffic can become gratitude for a car, gas, a/c, music, a moment to breathe.

**4-Focus on the present moment.** You don't have to be anywhere other than where you are right now. Try doing one thing at a time and noticing what you see, hear, feel, taste, observe happening around you right now. Remember you are in this moment for a reason. Use it with intention. The next moment will wait and you can be in that moment when it arrives. Download a mindfulness app and try beginning a practice.

5-Define happiness internally. Notice where you are making happiness contingent on others and circumstances. Remind yourself gently that your happiness does not have to wait for everyone and everything to go your way. Remind yourself of what is good, what has been given to you already, and what can be enjoyed now even when life is complicated and messy.

Be kind to yourself and others as you practice shifting happiness from an external pursuit to an internal practice. Your internal work around happiness has the potential to change your daily mood and approach to life in meaningful ways. ## The Hope, by Herman Wouk

Herman Wouk is one of the greatest historical novelists ever. It began with "The Caine Mutiny" and continued with "The Winds of War" and "War and Remembrance". He saved his greatest work for last though: "The Hope" and "The Glory". These novels chronicle one of the most thrilling events of our time, the modern birth of Israel. After World War Two the Jews had had enough. They demanded their own homeland, Israel. This is the story of the Jewish migration and settlement of

that country. Balagan is a Hebrew word that can be translated as chaos or fiasco, and it's a word that comes up again and again in the novel set amid the several wars that forged the state of Israel. Instead of Roosevelt, we have Ben-Gurion, Israel's Churchill. Instead of Eisenhower, we have Moshe Dayan. The miracles of military ingenuity, raw courage ---sheer Chutzpah— have become the folklore of the Israeli Defense Forces. For example, when the army needed to find a road in order to break the Siege of Je-

rusalem in 1948, an American Colonel (made commander of the Jerusalem front by Ben-Gurion) managed to save the city with a barely passable, last-ditch road carved through winding mountains along old animal paths that bypassed enemy lines, bringing desperately needed supplies to the besieged city. Anticipating the next war, the undersized Israel air force bombed all of Egypt's runways keeping its planes out of the fight. This is the study of the world's largest underdog and its refusal to surrender. I once had the occasion

to speak to a Special Forces operator from Israel and asked why they fought so hard. He gave me a one-word answer in Hebrew that sounded like "Embara".

He later translated the word to mean "no choice" If the Arabs lose the war, they go home, if we lose we go into the sea.

as 169 students and as many as 49,619.

"The Aspen Prize is rooted first and foremost in an assessment of whether colleges are walking the walk," said Josh Wyner, executive director of the Aspen Institute College Excellence Program. "As community colleges face enrollment variations, enroll students with pandemic-related learning loss, and graduate students into a rapidly changing labor market, it is easy to lose track of what matters most. The best community colleges are continuing to focus on advancing the core mission: making sure as many students as possible graduate with credentials that lead to fulfilling careers and reflect the development of diverse talent that communities, states, and our nation need."

While community colleges are an essential contributor to our nation's success, student outcomes vary substantially among institutions. Aspen measures

those variances using multiple data sources and honors colleges with outstanding achievement in six critical areas: teaching and learning, certificate and degree completion, transfer and bachelor's attainment, workforce success, equitable access to the college, and equitable outcomes for students of color and students from low-income backgrounds.

In this first round, eligibility for the Aspen Prize is based on publicly available data. Colleges must show strong, improving, and equitable student outcomes in first-to-second year retention, credentials awarded, and completion and transfer rates. Nationwide, about 15 percent of community colleges have been invited to apply (150 of just under 1,000 public two-year colleges assessed for Prize eligibility).

Property tax notices were mailed on November 1 and the property tax roll is officially open for collection. You can now pay property taxes online, by drop box, by mail or by visiting a tax collector's office. If you haven't received a physical tax notice, notices can be accessed online at BayTaxCollector. com. Accounts can be searched by property owner, address, or property tax account number.

Here are a couple of tips for customers who want to make paying property taxes as simple as possible:

**Pay Online with an E-Check:** The quickest, easiest, and most cost-effective Property Tax Notices Mailed November 1st Tips for Easy and Quick Payment

payment option is online payment with an electronic check (e-check). All you need is your checking account number and routing number to pay online with an e-check. Online payment allows you to add multiple properties to your shopping cart and pay all in one transaction. There is no wondering if your mail payment made it to the office on time. Once paid, you can print out your statement with payment information printed at the bottom to serve as your receipt. The QR code below can be used to access our tax software to look up your account and pay online.



**Drop Box Payments:** Drop boxes are located at each of our offices and are a convenient option for individuals who want to physically deliver their payment to the office, but don't want to spend time in our busy lobbies. If you provide a self-addressed, stamped envelope with your payment, we will also mail you a physical receipt or you can go online and print your statement once your payment has been processed. The payment information will print at the bottom of the statement. Please do not include cash in any drop box transactions.

**Reminder for Owners** of Escrowed Properties: If your property is escrowed, your mortgage company will pay your taxes by the end of November allowing you to take advantage of the 4% November discount. You will receive a courtesy copy of your tax notice that will read "This is not a bill." This notice is simply for your records, please do not send in payment.

Payment by debit/credit

**cards:** Credit and debit cards can be used online or in-person to pay your property tax bill, but please note there is a 2.5% convenience fee on all credit card transactions, with a minimum of \$2.50 and a \$2.50 fee for debit card use. Florida law requires the tax collector to pass on any payment processing fees directly to the customer choosing to use the service. This fee is collected by the card processor and not the tax collector's office.

Assessed Value/ Exemptions: If you have questions related to the value of your property or your property tax exemptions, please contact the Property Appraiser's Office at (850) 248-8401 or (850) 248-8470.

Millage Rates/Special Assessments: If you have questions related to the millage rate or any special assessment, please contact the taxing district directly.

over again, by any measure, the children who waited succeeded in life at a much higher rate than those who didn't wait. Higher SAT Scores, graduation rates, income, job performance, net worth as well as overall life and relationship satisfaction were the norm in this group. Is there a message here for us?

True happiness, said Aristotle (c. 300 BC) is about developing daily spiritual habits and surrounding yourself with people who grow your soul. At the center of the spiritual life is the concept of delayed gratification. Delayed gratification is an essential element of self-control. Food, drugs, gambling, alcohol (ever had a hangover?), sex, screaming in anger, or overusing our credit cards don't necessarily bring out the best in us, they just ease our discomfort or satisfy our desires for a moment. Our modern society is one in which instant gratification is glorified and obtainable, becoming a barrier to many seeking the spiritual life. To some, these temptations open the door to turmoil, addiction, and death.

Jesus teaches us not to store up treasures on earth, but to store up our treasures in heaven. For where our treasure is there

## From the Office of Congressman Neal Dunn

The House finished October with a new Speaker of the House and restored vigor to keep our commitment to America. October also included some significant moments for Florida's Second Congressional District.

October 10 marked five years since Hurricane Michael devastated much of our district. Somehow, that storm feels like it was both yesterday and decades ago. In the past five years, we've rebuilt many structures destroyed by the storm. Mexico Beach no longer looks like a war zone, and we've welcomed the F-35 Lightning II to Tyndall AFB, which will significantly boost our local economy. I'll never forget the resilience and selflessness displayed in the weeks and months following the storm. That same generosity is still being displayed following Hurricane Idalia. If we've proven anything since 2018, it's that this district is one-of-a-kind and will always fight back when faced with adversity.

The truth is, in Florida, we do things differently. We're not

afraid to roll our sleeves up and get things done. My office, Governor Ron DeSantis, and the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM) are doing just that while helping Floridians evacuate Israel. Last month, Governor DeSantis announced that Florida was offering flights for Floridians stuck in Israel. This outstanding operation ensured the safety of hundreds of Floridians, including families from our district. I can't thank Governor DeSantis and FDEM enough for putting Floridians first and ensuring they're out of harm's way.

While the FDEM flights cost Floridians nothing, the U.S. State Department flights involve repayment. Americans can contact the federal government for help returning to America from dangerous situations; however, once brought to safety, they're hit with a bill for the services. I introduced a bill that seeks to waive this cost for these individuals and any American who needs evacuation from a warzone. No American should have to hesitate to ask for help when they are escaping terrorist attacks.

Towards the end of October, I joined Eastern Shipbuilding in celebrating the launch of the U.S. Coast Guard Offshore Patrol Cutter Argus. The story of this cutter is truly unique and one of perseverance. In the days that followed Hurricane Michael, not only did neighbors lean on neighbors, but Eastern Shipbuilding workers returned to their yard with shovels and saws in hand to do their part. Eastern's leadership self-funded temporary homes for employees impacted by this once-in-a-generation storm. This offshore patrol cutter means so much more than many realized.
