
Missing Christmas





Pier Park Mural Highlights Gulf Sea Life

Visitors to Pier Park beginning this month will have the opportunity of learning about the enormous variety of sea life in the Gulf of Mexico as they walk from the east parking lot to the storefronts on Pier Park Drive.

Thanks to a private partnership between Pier Park and Sky-Wheel Panama City Beach, the 53-foot pedestrian breezeway between Smoothie King and Kilwins Chocolate & Ice Cream has been transformed into an "underwater tunnel" featuring painted images of local sea life. Artist Kollet Hardeman, who specializes in outdoor murals,

was selected to paint the two 15-by-53-foot wall murals and a larger rendition on the breezeway ceiling.

Born and raised in Tallahassee, Hardeman said she has been fascinated with painting since her elementary school years. "I was always that kid in class who was coloring all of the time," she said. Currently a resident of Auston, Texas, Hardeman said she was delighted to return to Panama City Beach for the project.

After a brief career in mortgage banking, Hardeman - still driven to be a painter – became interested in creating outdoor murals. Over the past decade, she has completed 81 separate projects in Florida and Texas, including a sea life mural at the Days Inn by Wyndham at 12818 Front Beach Road.

"It just took off," she said of mural art. "I learned how to contain my energy."

For the Pier Park breezeway, Hardeman applied a primer coat, then added layers of sea foam blue, teal and dynamic blue background paint for the underwater background. During a week of dawn-to-dusk brushwork late last month, she added images of local sea life. This includes Pompano, Sergeant Major, Snapper, Grouper, Mahi Mahi, Leatherback

Turtle, Dolphin, Queen Angel, Sheepshead and Octopus. Crowning the project is a massive rendition of a Great White Shark overhead.

The \$25,000 mural is the first private project approved by the city's Public Art Committee since its inception last year, according to committee Chair Helen Ferrell. Aware of the growing popularity of outdoor art, the city formed the panel to review public art works for quality and - equally important durability.

"You don't want to have something go up that won't last very long," Ferrell told PCB Life. Our climate is harsh on objects resting outdoors, particularly paintings and sculptures. "We want to make sure that this is something that is going to last."

Pier Park Marketing Director Lee Ann Leonard said that the proliferation of public art in Bay County, including mural projects cropping up in Panama City, had triggered the idea of transforming the blank pedestrian tunnel into artwork.

"Because of Pier Park's proximity to the beach and fishing pier, transforming the breezeway into an underwater tunnel seemed like a natural fit," Leonard said.

Leonard credited Hardeman for recommending an educational element to the mural project. Pier Park plans to mount a bronze plaque in the breezeway containing an index of the sea life featured in the artwork. Families can try to match the images to the index.

Bay County Audubon Offers "Invitation to a Safari"

Bay County Audubon Society will celebrate its third Nature Connection Program April 6 at the Holley Center, FSU-PC campus, with Tom Nkwazi as the highlighted presenter. "Big Tom" as he is known in his African home of Botswana, has been a fully-licensed professional safari guide for 15 years. He brings a rich knowledge of wild Africa to our area, a once-in-a lifetime opportunity to learn about the environmental issues facing the shrinking African habitat that hosts elephants, lions, wildebeest, hippos, giraffes, antelopes, and exotic birds, to name a few, all in a raw display of nature. You will be hearing first-hand about the "circle of life", a real life Lion King story.

Big Tom currently guides in the northern part of Botswana, in the Okavango Delta, close to Chobe National Park (home to 100,000 plus elephants) and world-famous Victoria Falls. A quick google search will reveal the magic of the Okavango Delta, an oasis in a desert of exquisite wildlife nourished by a river which sustains the entire ecosystem. In the rainy season, the land erupts in glorious beauty due to the seasonal water supply which creates the Delta. In the dry season, the animals compete for water in the diminished rivers and waterholes, creating an ideal context within which to view local wildlife.

Attendees will be privy to incredible environmental les-





sons by Big Tom Nkwazi as he recounts his experiences with photos and videos, some taken from the front seat of his special-edition LandCruiser. Get a front row seat yourself to hear all about the magnificent safari experience. What questions do you have about African safaris. Are they safe? Are they expensive? Why are they worth it? Is there anything you can you do to help protect the unique habitat that is the African savanna? Big Tom will tell us.

In addition, Bay County Audubon has invited Noah Strycker to return as a Nature Connection speaker to give the audience an update of his area

of nature expertise, the status of the Emperor Penguin, recently suffering nesting issues due to loss of Antarctic sea ice. At our previous Nature Connection event in 2022, Noah delivered an amazing standing-ovation presentation on his world record-setting around the world birding odyssey during which he visited 41 countries, identifying 6,042 bird species. He will be back on April 6 also to relate his

experiences living with an Em-

peror Penguin colony, recalling "The March of the Penguins" movie. He will be visiting many of our local schools to give educational programs about the penguin and nature.



Let's Get Growing with Julie: **Reindeer Moss**

By JULIE MCCONNELL, UF/IFAS EXTENSION As the weather cools off many people take to the trails to explore beautiful Northwest Florida beyond the beaches. If

you find yourself hiking through state parks, national parks, or other undeveloped natural areas you will likely spot common native plants including oaks, pines, palmetto, and goldenrod. But as

you are walking, be sure to take notice of the area beneath the trees and shrubs or you might walk right past a patch of reindeer moss!

Reindeer moss forms masses of small lacey looking graygreen balls that live on top of sandy soil in undisturbed areas. Technically a lichen, reindeer moss is composed of a mutualistic relationship between a fungus and a blue-green algae and has no roots. The fungus provides structure and form to the lichen and the algae makes food through photosynthesis. Reproducing by spores, reindeer moss can cover large bare areas of full to part sun in the forest. Upon close inspection you will notice intricately formed rounded balls that remind me of snowballs each with unique branching details.

Although we don't have reindeer in Florida, reindeer lichen may be a food source for native white-tailed deer and is utilized by native birds for nesting material as well as a food source for insects. Know Your Neighbor: Kim Crowell Changes Her Life by Stretching Her Limits

Kim Crowell can tell you all about the benefits of stretching. Stretching not only helps improve flexibility, helps keep muscles strong, helps to prevent injuries and improves range of motion. It can also help change your life as it did hers.

Ten years ago, Kim Crowell's world was all about software programming in the world of Information Technology (IT). After a 30-year career in IT working for International companies such as Electronic Data Systems (EDS), Kimberly-Clark Corporation, and Nestle', Crowell's life suddenly changed course.

In 2016, Crowell was diagnosed with a very rare disease called Portopulmonary Hypertension and would require a life-saving Liver Transplant which cut short her career in IT. For Crowell, her life changed overnight. "I was doing a project in the Nashville area, and we just finished up phase one, I went from being in a meeting one day to being in ICU with Liver and Kidney failure the next day. They didn't expect me to make out of the hospital... there was no choice but for me to have a transplant."

After receiving the transplant, Crowell found both a new ambition and direction after taking on a variety of volunteer roles including Ambassador for American Liver Foundation, Donate Life America and Global Liver Institute. During recovery, Crowell would discover a new way for her to stretch her limits.

"After my transplant, I had a long recovery, so I had started working out again. A friend of mine who is a massage therapist in Dothan told me about a stretch place in Birmingham. I started doing a little reading about it and doing research on assisted stretching. So, I made an appointment to go and try Stretch Zone and it was amazing and I never felt so good."

After recovery, Crowell was eager to get back out into business and decided to try something different.

"After my transplant we moved back to Dothan for my husband and in Spring of 2021 I was working on a business plan.

So, I decided to give Stretch Zone a call and talk to them about franchising. I really liked their model and what they did. It was in line with what I wanted to do which is doing something good for people which was my number one goal and trying to give back to the community and giving people the opportunity for a job and something I could feel good about," she explains.

In November of 2021, Crow-

ell opened her first Stretch Zone location in Dothan and shortly after started looking at locations in the Florida panhandle. It's a decision that Crowell has not regretted.

"I love the panhandle, so I decided to open two stores, Destin and Panama City Beach and in October of this year, we opened the Panama City Beach store in Pier Park. It's been very well received." Crowell plans to keep expanding in the Panhandle with a Stretch Zone location on Highway 30-A opening early next year as well as getting involved with the community by sponsoring the Panama City Beach Marathon.

Seven years ago, Kim Crowell's life changed, however with some positivity and flexibility (both literally and figuratively), she has managed to make the most out of her second chance.

"I'd like to be remembered as someone who used their second chance in life to try to do something good for people and make something out of it and make it about giving back to the community," she says. "My goal is to get up everyday and make my donor proud of me and if I do something everyday to make her proud of me then I feel like I deserved the gift that I got."







A Jingle Jangle Christmas Music Revue, Yes Virginia there is a Santa Claus and the beautiful Charles Dickens classic, A Christmas Carol.





Great Expectations Make Marriages Flourish

Couples get what they expect. One primary difference between couples who make it and those who don't is that those who stay happy have high expectations for their marriage and each other.

This may seem a bit counterintuitive. I'm sure you've heard many relationship experts (or your own mom) say that the main cause of marital unhappiness and the high divorce rate is that couples have unrealistically high expectations for each other and their marriage.

However, relationship research suggests otherwise. According to clinical psychologist and creator of Cognitive-Behavioral couples therapy Donald Baucom, the couples with the greatest expectations for their relationship and each other usually create the highest quality marriage.

I think it works like this: Couples with high expectations for the well-being of their relationship work hard to maintain positive feelings toward each other, and they stay optimistic about their relationship and are resilient in the face of inevitable relationship and life challenges.

Fortunately, all three of these characteristics can be learned.

Maintaining Positive Feelings

Positive feelings about each other form the foundation of relationship well-being. John Gottman stipulates that fondness and admiration are two of the most important elements in maintaining a rewarding, long-lasting marriage and that, without them, couples will not thrive.

Most couples begin their marriage with positive feelings about one another and can easily maintain them until something goes wrong. To guard against this, couples with high expectations for their relationship take action to maintain and increase their positive emotion about the present by turning toward each other for quality conversation and connection, physical pleasures, and enjoying activities together.

Equally, if not more important, these couples also know how to restore their positive feelings for each other after a negative relationship incident by cultivating forgiveness and gratitude. They have learned how to make meaningful apologies, which promotes trust. They have learned the value of true forgiveness, which comes easier because of their overarching positive regard for one another promotes empathic understanding. And they re-focus on the positive aspects of their partner and their relationship by adopting an attitude of gratitude.

The Optimism -Resilience Connection

High expectations inherently create a sense of optimism about the future. Positive psychologist Martin Seligman's PERMA theory of well-being stipulates that Optimism is one of the "key contributors" to individual wellbeing. And I believe that a couple's Optimism about their relationship is also one of the "key contributors" to their relationship wellbeing because optimism promotes a couple's belief that they can and will work together successfully to:

• cope with each other's minor mistakes or relationship transgressions (e.g., everything from forgetting to pay the bills to lying about it);

• respond to negative external influences (e.g., challenging in-laws, unexpected home repairs);

• adapt to challenging life experiences (e.g., becoming parents, serious illness, job loss).

Relationship Resilience requires that couples have positive emotions, communication skills, and cognitive and behavioral flexibility. Couples with high expectations and the associated optimism about their relationship, either have these qualities or use their combined resources to learn and master the skills needed to move through the challenge. These couples flourish as a result of the renewed




relationship commitment their resilient effort required and the relationship pride they feel as a result of their success. Couples who stay happily married aren't happy with each other every day.

Like all couples, those who flourish experience the dynamic ups and downs of everyday family life, financial concerns, in-law issues, housework, worklife balance, and the stress of creating happy holiday experiences for their family.

Couples who flourish also have high positive expectations for the well-being of their relationship. They work at maintaining positive feelings about one another, and their high positive expectations engender optimism that drives resilience in the face of internal or external challenges to their relationship. As a result, these couples get what they expect.

If you've lost optimism for your relationship or are having difficulty mustering the relation-

By Dr. Richard Chern M.D. Sleeping through the night seems like an impossible task for many of us. Waking up at three or four in the morning can be an everyday ordeal for many as we age. You should already know sleep is one of the most important tools to heal our bodies, maintain the immune system, keep our mind invigorated and our memory healthy. So, you would think we would sleep better as we age.

The effects of sleep deprivation are more than just a day of feeling tired and fighting to make it through. Sleep deprivation has been well studied and has catastrophic long-term results. Besides daytime sleepiness, irritability and a shortened attention span, sleep deprivation causes obesity, hypertension, diabetes, anxiety, heart attacks, reduced sex drive, impaired memory, and depression. That's not, might cause, that's does cause.

Did you know that the rate of heart attacks increases with daylight savings? A New England Journal of Medicine study



Just One Good Night of Sleep





I hope you took my advice last month and read "The Hope" by Herman Wouk. If you did, get ready for "The Glory." Both books cover the birth of Israel and its turbulent history. "The Hope" opens in 1948 and culminates with the triumph of the Six Day War in 1967. As the story resumes in "The Glory," Wouk portrays the young nation of Israel once again pushed to the brink of annihilation and sets the stage for today's ongoing struggle for peace. Wouk takes us from the Sinai to Jerusalem to the raid on Entebbe and from Camp David to the lives of historical figures like Golda Meir, a Bronx housewife who, as Prime Minister, steered Israel to several victories. This book is definitely the easiest and best way to read the history of Israel in the 1960s and 1970s. I did start to wonder what the rate of affairs and divorce in Israel was during this time period, because it seems



like all of the characters were embroiled in torrid affairs and had turbo charged libidos. This may have occurred due to the thought "party tonight, for tomorrow we die." These extraordinary novels have the authenticity of all of Wouk's books and together strike a chord of hope for all of us. These are two of my favorite books and I encourage you to run, not walk to your nearest bookstore or library.

Taxes

It's no secret that taxes are heading up across the board. Many increases have been legislated and more are on the way. Does it make sense to pay taxes now under low Trump Era rates or wait until they increase? For many it might be a great time for a Roth Conversion. This strategy involves converting IRA assets to a Roth IRA and paying the income taxes in the current period. If early in retirement, this can be a great way to get tax free income in the future. Additionally, tax efficiency can be achieved utilizing a mix of account types, trusts, tax deferral and tax-free investments like municipal bonds.

Income

The most common question we get when meeting for the first time with prospective clients is: How can I generate enough income with my retirement savings to maintain a certain lifestyle AND not run out of money? At Gulf Financial, income is job one. If we can create enough income the rest of the plan becomes simple. Fortunately there are a number of ways an independent Fiduciary advisory can create income. With interest rates at a 30 year high, it's a great time to buy Fixed Income instruments such as CD's, Pension Annuities, structured notes, dividend stocks, and high quality corporate bonds. We are seeking to create yield (that means earnings) in client portfolios above 6 percent at a very

low risk to principal. As we near or enter retirement our focus must shift from growth to asset preservation and income. When buying Fixed Income, utilize a ladder strategy and buy several different maturities at once.

Risk

Most economists and stock analysts perceive that there is significant risk in the current market. There are a few economic indicators that would suggest we are heading for recession and market correction sometime in 2024. The first indicator is what we term an inverted yield curve. That's when the 2 year treasury bond pays more than the 10 year treasury. That's the current situation. A recession has occurred 100% of the time this has happened in the past. It may not happen again but we are ready if it does. Another indicator is the Price/Earnings (PE)ratio of the market. PE ratio is a valuation measure. It is very high now and that's a signal that stocks are overvalued and ripe for a pullback. Our experience tells us most retirees are far too aggressively invested in mutual fund and etf portfolios. Reduce risk by hedging your bet with risk-free, principal protected, and buffered products in the Fixed Income markets. Consider reducing equity exposure and increasing your cash position as current money market rates are approaching 6%. Any large drawdowns are destructive and catastrophic to a retirement plan and must be avoided.

It's a great time for a second opinion. Analyze your current portfolio and take steps now to protect your future. Consider an Independent Fiduciary Advisory like Gulf Financial, required by law to always act in your best interest.

The Tax Season Hustle & Bustle Makes December A Busy Month for Tax Collector Offices

Heed these reminders to insure a top notch customer service experience



December is one of the busiest months of the year for the Tax Collector's Office. Trays of mailed property tax payments come rolling in each day in addition to increased lobby traffic due to property tax season. To assist customers who need to visit the office this month, here are a few things to keep in mind as the holiday season approaches:

Holiday Office Closure: Before you make plans to visit an office, please check our website for holiday closures.

Online Services: Many services, including registration renewals and property tax pay-

ments, can be completed online at BayTaxCollector.com. You can pay online with an e-check for FREE!

Drop Boxes: Drop boxes are located at each of our office locations. You can drop off your property tax payment (no cash please) without having to wait or step foot into the lobby.

Road Test Eligible Drivers: If you have a driver who is eligible to take the road test in December, please make an appointment at BayTaxCollector. com. Appointments are available at all four offices and are required to take a road test. When you bring in your driver for his/ her road test, you will need the following:

• A parent/guardian must accompany the driver to the office if the driver is under 18.

• Proof of Florida insurance on the vehicle being driven for the test.

• Vehicle horn, brake lights, turn signals and seat belts must

all be working and windshield be free of cracks to pass safety inspection.

• Driver must have held a learner's permit for one full year if under 18 to be eligible to take the road test.

Heavy Vehicle Use Tax Renewals: The HVUT is a fee assessed by the federal government for vehicles over 55,000 pounds operating on public roadways. The fee is due in August of each year, but proof of submitted tax (IRS Form 2290) OR proof of payment (credit/debit card receipt or front/back of cancelled check or other receipt for payment) is required, along with proof of insurance when renewing the registration for these large vehicles, each December.

If you have a fleet of HVUT vehicles in need of renewal, please plan accordingly to ensure you have the correct paperwork and your renewals are submitted on time. If you need a copy of your 2290, we recommend you request it early.

Heavy Trucks: In addition to HVUT vehicle requirements, vehicles with a gross weight of 26,001 pounds or more are also required to provide a proof of commercial vehicle insurance in the form of a Certificate of Liability Insurance or the ACORD form. These must be presented at renewal time as they contain information that must be entered

into the state renewal system for a registration to be issued.

Mobile Home Renewals: In the state of Florida, mobile homes must be registered. A numbered decal, instead of a metal license plate, is issued for identification. State statute requires mobile home registrations be renewed annually by December 31, unless assessed as real property. A delinquent fee is charged if the registration is not renewed by the 10th of the following month.

During the holiday closure, many services can be accessed at

BayTaxCollector.com or through the State's website at https:// mydmvportal.flhsmv.gov. A self-service registration renewal kiosk is also available in the Publix on 23rd Street. You can renew your vehicle registration and print your decal on site. Please note vehicle registrations more than eight months delinquent as well as vessel and mobile home registrations do require a visit to our office.

Vehicle Renewal Kiosk: A vehicle renewal kiosk is located inside the Publix on 23rd Street near the cash registers. You can renew your vehicle registration and print your decal on a weekend, after hours, or while grocery shopping via the kiosk. Additional service fees apply.

Insights for Investors: Fear or Optimism for Investors

It has been noted that most people, when they hear or read things that speak to fear, respond with seeing that (about 70% of people) as credible. They believe it, or are motivated by it, or act because of it. Optimism by contrast tends to stir skepticism. Today's investors and savers are faced with both messages on almost a daily basis.

Inflation has had its steepest decline in over 70 years, yet most consumers don't see it that way and are fearful for the economy. That is either because of what they experience at the grocery store or the gas pump. And for sure those on the lower end

of the income spectrum feel it mostly because they spend most of their money on living vs. saving or investing or buying luxuries. Gas prices, when adjusted for inflation, are lower than they were 45 years ago. When adjusted for inflation, a gallon of gas in 1978 was \$4.37 in today's dollars. As of October of this year, it was \$3.91 (down from \$4.11 in September). And cars are more fuel efficient today. In other words, it takes fewer gallons today to go 100 miles than it did 45 years ago. The fear is that this necessity is more expensive than ever. The optimism is that it means consumers have more dollars to spend on other things. Consumer spending tends to support that.

Groceries are of significance. Groceries, like most other things, went up over 10% in 2022. So far in 2023, they are up 3.7% year over year. The inflation rate (The Labor Department's number) came in at 3.2% for all inflation when that was reported in mid-November. That is down from over 9% late summer of 2022. Groceries over time have been closer to the overall infla-



tion rate of 3.2%. Many grocery store chains passed their costs on to consumers, and one concern is that they are paying lower wholesale prices now, yet they are not passing those onto the consumer. Their earnings tend to suggest that.

Have you ever heard of FOMO? That is "fear of missing out." That drives buying and investing behavior, because people see it as credible. The problem is that asset prices (think the so called magnificent seven stocks or housing prices over the last few years) accelerate well beyond their long-term valuations in a very short period. Some also call that a form of momentum investing. These assets appreciate with added risk. But, the fear of missing out is beyond the fear of these assets perhaps being overpriced.

Many investors think that U.S. companies, beyond those seven (Tesla, Amazon, Nvidia, Apple, Microsoft, Alphabet, and Meta), are performing rather poorly. The rest of the stock market – the other approximate 3,500 stocks – have been relatively flat. Earnings growth for the S&P 500 is now positive at approximately 3.2 year over year.

Raymond James Chief Investment Officer Larry Adams (CIO) note: "With 80% of the S&P market cap having reported, the 3Q 23 earnings season was generally solid. The earnings recession officially ended as the S&P 500 posted its first quarter of YoY EPS growth in four quarters, and the percentage and magnitude of beats were both above the 10-year averages. The strongest performers were the mega cap names, which saw earnings growth of >40% YoY during the quarter."

We take note that historically stock prices tend to follow earnings. That is optimism, however, not fear.

The optimist sees huge growth in productivity, economic and wealth growth.

The pessimist sees job losses, even though past technological innovations have resulted in job gains and standard of living gains. The potential impact across all sectors of the market and the industries they represent could be substantial.

Current rates on cash like alternatives like CDs is over 5%. Many investors and savers have taken advantage of this and are shying away from equities or even bonds. The common theme is that this is the most practical approach. Historically, when investing for the long term, if investors wait to see if stocks and bonds do better, they might be missing out on the potential growth when the market rebounds.

The national debt is over 33 trillion dollars. The fear is that the U.S. debt is not sustainable and there is nothing that will be done, and the standard of living and economic progress are going down along with the U.S. dollar. The optimism is that the U.S. historically has figured things out. One example of that is the dollar has appreciated vear to date. The big three are Social Security, Medicare and Medicaid. The optimist says that the USA, for over 70 years, continues to lead the world economically. Its population and consumption are growing and that its open society make it a bastion for innovation and invention. Sustained economic growth (compare post WW2) can lead an economy to significantly reduce its debt to GDP over time.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew at 4.9% in the most recent quarter with historical averages of over 2% (Statista notes GDP averaged 2.1% from

1990 to 2022). We believe that productivity is growing, consumer spending has been resilient, that unsustainable growth of entitlement programs will be addressed, that inflation will continue to wane and that short-term rates will begin their decline soon. That is optimism. We tend to think it has credibility, but also acknowledge our thinking is in the minority.

From the Office of Congressman Neal Dunn



Florida's Second Congressional District has a lot to be thankful for in November! There were multiple wins that will help grow our communities and benefit our local economy.

The U.S. Department of Transportation announced an \$11,250,000 FY23 Port Infrastructure Development Program grant for the expansion of Port Panama City. This grant funding is outstanding news for Florida's Second Congressional District! I sent a letter of support for this grant in April 2023, and I'm thrilled to see this come to fruition. The award allows the port to expand cargo handling capacity at its East Terminal, which will create over 300 jobs and millions of dollars in revenue. The Port

Panama City Expansion Project includes the construction of a 200,000-square-foot warehouse facility to handle the growth of forest product imports and exports, along with associated rail spur extension, and terminal roadway improvements to serve the warehouse. I'm looking forward to the great things to come from Port Panama City, and I stand ready to help boost our local economy in any way possible.

In addition to this announcement, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) denied a petition to establish a mandatory 10knot speed limit in the Gulf of Mexico. Florida's commercial fishermen as well as those in the tourism and shipping industries rely heavily on the Gulf of Mexico. This rule would have slowed shipping lines, devastated the seafood industry, and impacted hundreds of jobs. I first sounded the alarm on this issue in May 2023 when I led a letter to NOAA requesting that they not finalize this overreaching proposed rule. In August, I also joined Congressman Clay Higgins (LA-03) in introducing a bill that would prevent NOAA from issuing a vessel slowdown zone in the Gulf of Mexico.

Later in the month, my team was honored to attend the Tyndall Air Force Base 325th Fighter Wing F-35 Arrival Ceremony. General Brian Laidlaw, commander of the base when Hurricane Michael hit, said it best when he said that it wasn't about focusing on the destruction, it was about focusing on the people the storm impacted and how, with determination and tenacity, they are rebuilding Tyndall. Colonel George Watkins, the current base commander, reminded us that the construction of the "base of the future" is an amazing thing to witness, and the official arrival of the F-35s should be celebrated.

I want to thank the Bay County Defense Alliance, the Bay County Chamber of Commerce, local leaders, and the community at large for joining me in supporting Tyndall in its time of need and preventing the base from closing. I don't know about you, but I'm looking forward to hearing the constant sound of freedom as our F-35s are in the sky.
