Finding Florida: Nature and History Come Together at the Tallahassee Museum

In a peaceful 52-acre forest of oak, pine, and cypress at the edge of Florida's capital, the quiet is broken by a pair of honking geese, a snorting horse, and the kinds of woodsy sounds you'd expect of such a sylvan location. Here at the Tallahassee Museum, however, there's more on offer than animal noises and an introduction to the region's heritage. A startling rustle in the tree canopy overhead and an exhilarated scream breaks the calm. It trails off into the foliage as someone flies past overhead, harnessed to a very high cable threading through the treetops, all part of the museum's Tallahassee Treeto-Tree Adventures zipline courses. It becomes quickly clear this isn't your ordinary non-profit. Yes, you'll find a visit to this cultural gem educational and even inspiring, but you also have the opportunity to get up close and personal with Florida at heights hitherto unexperienced (and possibly scare yourself just a



little in the process).

Established in 1957, this museum offers a glimpse into the area's history, showcasing structures that date back to

the 19th century. One of the allowing visitors to imagine museum's highlights is the historic farm, with authentically restored buildings. Each structure is meticulously preserved,

Thanksgiving **Proclamation** of 1789

By the President of the United STATES OF AMERICA GEORGE WASHINGTON, A PROCLAMATION

Whereas it is the duty of all Nations to acknowledge the providence of Almighty God, to obey his will, to be grateful for his benefits, and humbly to implore his protection and favor - and whereas both Houses of Congress have by their joint Committee requested me to recommend to the People of the United States a day of public thanksgiving and prayer to be observed by acknowledging with grateful hearts the many signal favors of Almighty God especially by affording them an opportunity peaceably to establish a form of government for their safety and happiness.

Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th day of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be — That we may then all unite in rendering unto him our sincere and

ter was pumped by hand, everyone shared one bedroom, and hurricanes hit without warning.

Russell Daws, President/ CEO of the Tallahassee Museum, highlights the Museum's unique appeal, which stems from its expansive outdoor campus. The Museum integrates a biodiverse natural landscape with historic buildings, living exhibits of Florida's native wildlife, and a variety of history, natural science, and art displays. Each visit offers an immersive experience, inviting guests of all ages to explore, learn about, and connect with Florida's rich history and natural wonders.

The newest attraction at the Tallahassee Museum isn't an old building but the enclosure hosting four red foxes rescued from a fur farm through an organization near Jacksonville, OtterSpace Wildlife, aka the Ark Wildlife Care and Sanctuary, working with the Save a Fox Foundation. Of these four, only one, the lone male, Boots, looks like a red fox. The rest are white with gray, the result of a breeding process that targets the eight





genes controlling fur coloration, explains Suzie Buzzo, the Museum's animal curator. Now, with space to move, these foxes, including two sisters, are finding their new normal. Buzzo feeds them different types of food they ignore the bananas and dislike peanuts so much they take them away and bury them, but seem to be fond of hot dogs. One of the females cautiously takes a hot dog morsel from my



fingers before ducking back into the foliage. It becomes clear that each fox has its own temperament. Boots is a pacer, uneasy around people, but the females appear more interested in human interaction. When one fur farmer who'd been passing on the misfit foxes deemed unsuitable for furs went to visit the refuge where they were being housed, he was so taken enough with their friendliness and personality that he shuttered his farm. Currently, there are still 250 fur farms in 21 U.S. states, but these lucky foxes have a better future ahead. Tallahassee Museum will be housing them temporarily while a gentleman in Jacksonville finishes building enclosures to provide safe haven for 89 rescued foxes.

In addition to fox-watching, leave time for a leisurely meander along peaceful trails traversing the museum grounds. Stop to spot the turtle hiding under a submerged log in the new alligator enclosure but don't linger so long you miss the bald eagles, the black bear snoozing in a sunny spot, or the endangered red wolves taking a break from parenting their pups to enjoy some fresh air and exercise.

Though these animal visits are special, it's hard to match the adrenaline rush of the high-octane zipline experience. While anyone with a serious fear of heights might opt to stick to terra firma, the adventurous won't want to miss this tree-top tour. Obstacles are interspersed between "zips" and even though you're safely latched in throughout, stepping off the edge into the ether takes some getting used to. Once you do though, you'll be making exhilarated noises of your own.

If there's yet time for more, supplementing these zoological experiences are a range of educational programs. Additionally, the museum hosts special events throughout the year, including nature walks, historical reenact-

ments, and their popular annual arts and crafts market, Market Days. For a current schedule and more information visit tallahasseemuseum.org.

humble thanks — for his kind care and protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation — for the signal and manifold mercies, and the favorable interpositions of his Providence which we experienced in the course

to all the people, by constantly being a Government of wise, just, and constitutional laws, discreetly and faithfully executed and obeyed — to protect and guide all Sovereigns and Nations (especially such as have shewn kindness unto us) and to bless them with good government, peace, and concord — To promote the knowledge and



and conclusion of the late war — for the great degree of tranquility, union, and plenty, which we have since enjoyed — for the peaceable and rational manner, in which we have been enabled to establish constitutions of government for our safety and happiness, and particularly the national One now lately instituted--for the civil and religious liberty with which we are blessed; and the means we have of acquiring and diffusing useful knowledge; and in general for all the great and various favors which he hath been pleased to confer upon us.

And also that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations and beseech him to pardon our national and other transgressions — to enable us all, whether in public or private stations, to perform our several and relative duties properly and punctually — to render our national government a blessing

practice of true religion and virtue, and the encrease of science among them and us — and generally to grant unto all Mankind such a degree of temporal prosperity as he alone knows to be best.

Given under my hand at the City of New York the third day of October in the year of our Lord 1789.

Washington issued a proclamation on October 3, 1789, designating Thursday, November 26 as a national day of thanks. In his proclamation, Washington declared that the necessity for such a day sprung from the Almighty's care of Americans prior to the Revolution, assistance to them in achieving independence, and help in establishing the constitutional government


Police Chief Recognized and Honored

Rodeo Success! Veterans Honored! Turkey Bowl Coming! And More!

We may be headed into a slower fishing season, but there is a lot going on at Capt. Anderson's Marina including winter fishing!

October's 2024 PCB Fishing Rodeo presented by Bill Cramer GM & Cramer Outdoor Marine and hosted by the Panama City Boatman's Association and Capt. Anderson's Marina was a great success! The PCBA Board of Directors, Kelia Paul, Pres., BJ Burkett, VP, Mike Sullivan, Treas., Justin Steele, Director, and Chris Ngyuen Director, all did a fabulous job of planning and managing the event. All own and operate their own Charter-for-hire businesses at Capt. Anderson's.

There were 94 entrants in the rodeo with 60 Recreational entries from land based to vessels over 26' & 34 charter-for-hire vessels. Altogether there were 4265.3 lbs. of fish weighed in during the 9-day event with over 467 individual weigh-ins.

The ladies division (brand

new for this year) weighed in 304.33 lbs. over 43 total weighins. Great job ladies!

The kids division (also brand new for this year) weighed in 629.39 lbs. over 73 total weighins. Each child who weighed in a fish whether it made the board or not received a free fishing rod & reel — thank you Half Hitch Tackle for always being a great community partner! Combined with those and the rods given away during the Kid's Fishing Clinic presented by the Reel ladies, PCBA gave away 230 rods during the tournament sponsored by Half Hitch Tackle and Tarpon Docks Seafood.

For the overall tournament winners PCBA gave away \$25,500 in cash including the jackpot winners who all received \$2,500 each: The largest fish overall (by lbs.) 71.1 Amberjack caught aboard the Tail Hunter with Captain Scott Ngyuen by Ali Danun. The largest shark (by lbs.) 285.4 was a Bullshark caught aboard the Kelley Girl with Captain August Redding



by Juan Tinajero. The largest Inshore fish (Trout or Flounder) 3.24lb Speckled Trout was caught by one of our local kid Anglers, Kai McDaniel. Daily winners received a total of \$1,350 in gift cards (6 each day over the 9 day tournament).

From the proceeds, the tournament will be donating \$1,000 to the Arnold High School Fishing Team to further their education of the industry.

What a great community-wide event! Thank you Panama City Boatman's Association and all those who contributed to its success — including our Tourist Development Council that contributed the Fireworks

to round out the event.



Let's Get Growing with Julie: Winter Color in the Garden

My favorite time of year has always been the fall. College football, lower temperatures and humidity, and approaching holidays are seasonal activities I start to look forward to as soon as the thermometer hits 90. Just like some people enjoy hot summer months while others prefer the cool of fall and winter, our

annual color plant palette has preferences, too.

Annual flowers and foliage plants fall into two general categories: warm season and cool season. Warm season annuals are typically sensitive to hard frosts but perform well during the spring and summer. Examples of warm season annuals are begonias, impatiens, coleus, zinnias, and vinca. If your home has a warm microclimate (sheltered from winter winds or near a large body of water helps) then you may be able to grow warm season plants yearround with just reduced growth in the winter. However, if your landscape gets exposure to winter winds and frost can settle you may want to consider switching to cool season annual color this month.

Here are a few frost tolerant plants to consider for your landscape to offer color through fall and winter!

Ornamental Cabbage and Kale

Just as this is the ideal time to plant edible cabbage and kale in your vegetable garden, you can also use ornamental versions of these plants for your landscape. The ornamental versions aren't very tasty, but their foliage is outstanding. Variations of straight edge or ruffled leaves, and colors that include all shades of green, white, cream, purple, and even pink tones are available. Be sure to check tags for mature width and spread and give them space to expand – some can get over a foot wide and tall!

Swiss Chard

This brightly colored ornamental plant can be eaten or just display showy colors in the garden. A few cultivars I like are 'Bright Lights' which has green leaves with green, orange, or red stems and 'Rhubarb' which has red leaves. You can harvest the leaves and stems and it will grow back repeatedly if given adequate water and nutrition.

Snapdragon

Snapdragons are a great way to add some vertical interest and color to your winter garden. Spikes of brightly colored flowers bloom all through-



out the cool season in Florida. There are many sizes and colors available, so be sure to check the label for mature size – some get 2-3 feet tall! These taller varieties make a wonderful backdrop for compact flowers and foliage plants. Flower colors range from white, yellow, pink, red, lavender to orange.

Pansies

Pansies thrive in cool weather and full sun. Although they are not what we might call "drought tolerant" be careful of overwatering since they are susceptible to several fungal diseases that is favored by extended periods of wet foliage. Pansies have compact green foliage growth topped by large colorful flowers in white, blue, yellow, orange, purple, red, or black. Many varieties have a distinctly different center or "eye" color.

Violas or Johnny Jump-ups

This close relative of pansies has a smaller, more delicate looking flower. Although not as showy as pansies, violas tend to be a little easier to care for so may be a better option for busy gardeners. Available in similar colors as pansies.

Swap out your warm season annuals for cool season plants a few weeks before the first anticipated frost date to ensure they have enough time to get established before a severe cold snap. Late October to mid-November is a good time to plan to make that transition in Panama City Beach.





ISO: PCB's Best Frozen Drink

The daiquiri's origin goes back to an actual cocktail recipe card signed by a "Jennings Cox" in 1896. This original recipe underwent an important transformation in the 1920s and 1930s when, with shaved ice and an electric blender, Constantino "Constante" Ribalaigua Vert,

bartender and owner of a little bar called Floridita in Havana, Cuba, perfected the drink. The frozen daiquiri was born. Ernest Hemingway happened into the bar soon after and sampled the frozen creation, then requested it without sugar and with double the rum due to his diabetes. The cocktail became conducive to epic drinking sessions and Hemingway became a regular. In one account, Hemingway put away 15 frozen daiquiris in one sitting. The "Hemingway Special" has a permanent spot on the menu.

Frozen Mason Jar Daiquiris: While researching this month's "Best Frozen Drink" section, I came across an article from *The Yummy Life* that showed a recipe, an easy one, for flavored frozen daiquiris. Each daiquiri contains frozen fruit (I guess you can say that's the healthy part), and they taste great. The best part is that you can mix several ahead of time and pour them into 16 oz. mason jars (now available at Michaels in Pier Park)

and freeze them until needed. Here's a helpful hint: leave some room at the top of the jar as they expand while they freeze! The alcohol keeps them from freezing completely, so just remove them from the freezer about 10 minutes before serving.

- 5 pounds Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled and cut into 3-inch chunks
- 5 pinches sea salt
- 1 pound sliced bacon
- 2 sticks unsalted butter, softened
- 1 1/2 cups heavy cream, slightly warmed
- 1 cup cheddar or gruyere cheese
- 1/2 cup minced chives freshly ground pepper

Preparation

Put the potatoes in a large pot and cover with water. Add salt and bring to a boil. Simmer over moderately high heat until tender, about 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a large skillet, cook the bacon in 2 batches over moderate heat, turning once, until crisp, 8 to 10 minutes per batch. Drain the



bacon on paper towels and coarsely chop it.

Drain the potatoes and return them to the pot. Shake the pot over moderately high heat for about 20 seconds to dry the potatoes. Remove. Pass the potatoes through a ricer into a large pot. Add the butter, cream, cheese, chives and bacon and stir well. Season with salt and pepper and





Fundraising Event Will Put Ukrainian Culture on Display

War-torn Ukraine, owing to continuing Russian aggression, is more heavily infected with landmines than any other nation in the world. From planes, drones and helicopters, Russian armed forces drop scads of small but deadly mines that fall gently to the ground like maple seeds.

As a result, Ukrainian farmlands are effectively removed from production and the flow of grain to Africa and other locations around the world is significantly impacted. No farmer dares enter his fields knowing that he or his equipment might detonate a powerful explosion.

ArroTech, a company housed at TechFarms in Panama City Beach, has developed capable of precisely pinpointing and mapping the locations of landmines and other unexploded ordnance. The drone has undergone rigorous testing in Ukraine, where it has successfully scanned and discovered suspected mines at a farm that has figured in battle.

ArroTech has a close relationship with altruTek, a nonprofit that is advancing humanitarian missions, including the demining of Ukraine, through the application of advanced technologies.

On Saturday, Nov. 9, Tech-Farms will present its second annual Ukrainian Culture Day, an event whose proceeds will go to altruTek. It will take place from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at 1002 Arthur Drive in Lynn a metal-detecting drone that is Haven — the former Sallie Mae and General Dynamics building, which was recently acquired by TechFarms.


More than 15 vendors will participate in the colorful, lively and educational event and will combine to represent aspects of the Ukrainian lifestyle ranging from food and dance to music and artisanal crafts. Attendees will discover and experience firsthand a culture that they may never have encountered previously.

Admission to the Ukrainian Culture Day benefiting altruTek is \$5. Children are admitted free of charge. In its first year, the event attracted 300 people and raised \$3,000. Organizers anticipate an even larger turnout this year.

Want to Be Right? Or Happily Married?



By Jamie C. Williamson, PhD You can be "right", or you can stay happily married.

That doesn't mean that if you want to stay happily married, you must be a doormat.

Instead, you must learn to accept that there is no objective reality in a relationship. There are two subjective realities - in your reality, you're right and in your partner's reality, they're right.

To stay happily married, you need to find a solution that works for both of you. You can do that by following my Home Team Approach to conflict resolution.

Consider these common conflict examples:

Example #1: Who Started It?

Jason and Ashley are eating at the bar of their favorite lo-

cal restaurant. Jason is flirting with a female acquaintance next to him and Ashley is talking to her sister on her phone. Once their food arrived, they turned toward each other. After their initial harsh "I can't believe you..." comments they barely spoke until they got into the car and their "who started it" fight broke out.

Ashley argued that Jason started it. She would not have called her sister if he had not been flirting.

Jason argued that Ashley started it. He only flirted because she was on the phone.

They will never be able to agree on who is right in this circular conflict. And, to stay happily married, they shouldn't even try.

Relationship communication is a series of continuous transactions. There is no clearly identifiable beginning or ending to any communication episode. When people think back over a stream of communication, they "punctuate" it by breaking it into smaller pieces and labeling some of the pieces causes and the other effects.

Punctuation allows people to identify the beginning and end of a communication event as a convenient way to understand and/or explain what happened



first, second, and so on.

And people punctuate interaction in self-serving ways that reflect better on themselves and are consistent with their self-im-

The Home Team Approach to Conflict Resolution

Jason and Ashley could settle this issue by following the Four Steps in the Home Team Approach:

- Internally accept that they both experienced the event differently.
 - Validate the other's reality.

- Acknowledge their own role in what went wrong and apolo-
- Commit to not letting something similar happen again.

Ashley: You must have felt so left out. I was having such a good conversation with my sister that I didn't realize how rude I was being to you. I'm so sorry.

Jason: You must have felt like I was trying to make you jealous. I just hadn't seen her in a while and wanted to catch up. I didn't think about how it might look to vou. I'm sorry, too.

Ashley: Well, what a waste of a date night for us. We know

Jason: Let's never let it happen again.

Example #2: No, you didn't. Yes, I did.

Gabe and Maria drove separate cars to their cabin in North Georgia. Maria asked Gabe to stay close to her because she was nervous about driving through Atlanta at night. Gabe promised he would. Gabe led and kept Maria's car in his rearview. But when he moved across lanes a car often got in between them. Maria felt panicky because she had difficulty identifying Gabe's car in the dark.

When they arrived, Maria initiated a fight, accusing Gabe of breaking his promise and causing her to feel unsafe. Gabe said she was being dramatic. He did not break his promise. He stayed close and could see her car the whole time. They replayed this "no, you didn't, yes I did" argument the entire weekend.

The Home Team Approach Alternative

Gabe: You must have been nervous. I didn't realize that you couldn't identify my car among the others at night. I'm so sorry. I always want you to know that I'm looking out for you.

Maria: No wonder you think I'm overreaching. I didn't realize you had your eye on me the whole time. Instead of fuming, I should have just called to say I couldn't find you in the traffic.


Gabe: I should have done more to ensure there were no cars between us.

Maria: Let's not waste another minute of our weekend on this. We'll do better next time.

People who care more about winning an argument and being "right" than repairing their relationship, often end up divorced. People who accept that in relationships there is no objective "right" or "wrong", can learn to maximize their "home team" advantage and stay happily married.


"The Gifts of Imperfection" by Brené Brown



go over the procedure in more depth and detail.

If you prefer another option, I would recommend a retinol or tretinoin cream. This cream is applied at nighttime and helps boost collagen and elastin and therefore over time will help with the appearance of fine lines and wrinkles. Please speak to your medical provider about this cream to make sure you are a good candidate and to go over specific instructions.

Lastly, getting in the habit of applying sunscreen every day will decrease sun damage and

the loss of collagen and elastin which will be a major factor in preventing fine lines and wrinkles in the future.

We ran through acres of green grass, alfalfa, and fresh cow pies. And we saw the biggest, best, most vivid rainbow ever.

So help me, the colors were touching the ground. The rainbow's tail was diving into the dirt like a spotlight.

I'd never seen anything like it. I didn't know rainbows actually touched the earth. This was highly unusual to me. The cows watched us with big eyes while we behaved like six-year-olds. My wife ran forward to get a better glimpse. I almost peed my pants again.

But here's where things get somewhat magical.

Have you ever tried to look at a rainbow up close? You can't do it. The colors disappear whenever you get too close. Then, the colors will reappear whenever you take several steps back.

It doesn't mean the rainbow isn't there. It's there the whole time, but you can only see it from certain angles.

We hiked back to the truck and I started crying. It wasn't a sad cry. It was the kind of happy cry you do when a baby is born, or at weddings, or when your team wins the SEC Championship—not that I would know what this is like.

I was crying because I was thinking of my father, and all my late loved ones. I was crying because even though I can't see them, up close, their colors are still here. In everything I do. In all parts of my life.

Life evaporates. It rises toward heaven at the speed of light. It reaches the top of the world, then disappears, and we're left with gray clouds. But the colors of someone's life remain.


Remember their colors, even though you can't always see their rainbow. Watch for the colors to reappear, because sometimes they frequently show up in the most random places. Even in cow pastures.

The Marshmallow Experiment

Don't we all love smore's? I do! On a recent mountain trip, we enjoyed them by the firepit. Melting chocolate and marshmallow oozing over a warm graham cracker is so delicious. Could you resist?

In 1972, an experiment was conducted at Stanford University. Children were brought into a room one at a time and sat down at a table. On the table was a marshmallow. The researcher told the children that he was leaving the room for 15 minutes and that if they did not eat the marshmallow, they would get a second one upon his return. A simple choice: one treat now or two later. Only 1 in 3 could wait. The really interesting part came later. Stanford researchers studied these children for 40 years (That's right!) and made an amazing discovery. Over and over again, by any measure, the children who waited succeeded in life at a much higher rate than those who didn't wait. Higher SAT Scores, graduation rates, income, job performance, net worth as well as overall life and relationship satisfaction were the norm in this group. Is there a message here for us?

True happiness, said Aristotle (c. 300 BC) is about developing daily spiritual habits and surrounding yourself with people who grow your soul. At the center of the spiritual life is the concept of delayed gratification. Delayed gratification is an essential element of self-control. When you disavow immediate pleasure to seek a long-term higher value goal, you are practicing delayed gratification. It is here that we will move toward our greatest potential in this life. Studies have shown, like the Marshmallow Experiment, that deferred gratification is one of the most effective personal traits of highly successful, happy people. People who learn to manage their need to be satisfied in the moment thrive more in their careers, relationships, and finances than people who give in to it.

This seems to be proof of a path to an abundant and fulfilling life in this earthly realm. What of the spiritual realm? One must have faith. Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things unseen. It is this Faith, this hope for the future that gives us the strength to deny ourselves, pick up the cross daily and walk in the will of our Maker. A life aligned with the will of God creates real joy that keeps our happiness meter on high!

Just think for a moment about some of the things in life that bring us immediate pleasure but can impose upon our physical, spiritual, and mental health.
