PCB West End Boom Is Coming

The scrub forest is gone, and heavy earth-moving equipment has cleared a fourteen-acre tract of land along the north side of Panama City Beach Parkway just west of the intersection with Front Beach Road.

At first glance, the development of Vintage Lake Powell does not appear to be a harbinger of dramatic change. When completed in late 2025 or early 2026, the mixed-use development will be one of several dozen residential housing communities underway throughout the Panama City Beach "island."

The project will comprise five 5-story buildings with 286 oneand two-bedroom apartments, and a handful of three-bedroom units, said Jake McDonald, president of the Nashville-based company Oldacre McDonald LLC, which is co-developer with another Tennessee firm, TDK Co. Two of the buildings will feature 20,000 square feet of businesses on the ground floor ranging from full-service restaurants to specialty retail outlets.

While adding only modestly to the area housing inventory,

Vintage Lake Powell nevertheless is symbolic of a major growth boom that will soon physically transform the west end of Panama City Beach.

For years, the area remained a quiet residential area with some commercial development along the parkway, avoiding the boom-and-bust development cycles of the early 2000s and 2010s that transformed the skyline of the Gulf beachfront. Most new construction consisted of individual houses replacing older cottages and smaller homes.

That era is over.

Panama City Beach and Bay County planners have identified five substantial development projects eyed for unincorporated Bay County west of the city limits in addition to Vintage Lake Powell. Many are in the preliminary planning and permitting process and do not yet have firm construction startup dates. They include:

* A future St. Joe Company residential project identified only as "Lake Powell," comprising a 2,100-acre swath of forest land north and west of





Wild Heron and the new Watersound Golf Course. Current plans call for 1,500 single-family homes and 125,000 square feet of commercial development.

* West Laird, a second major St. Joe residential community, will be located on 1,368 acres immediately east of the Lake Powell development. Currently, it is slated to have 2,390 residential lots when built, including

400 in the first two phases of development.

The timing on both projects is still somewhat undetermined and is probably between 5-10 years off, said Bay County Planning Director Wayne Porter. Both projects are "contingent" on the future extension of the Phil Griffitts Parkway west of its current terminus at SR 79, he

A St. Joe spokesman did not respond to a request for comments on the two massive projects.

* "West Lake," a multi-family development, is planned on both sides of Wild Heron Way just north of Panama City Beach Parkway. It will feature 750 apartments.

* Two hotels earmarked for a 5.5-acre lot on the north side of Front Beach Road on Jamaica Lake just east of the Bayou Bill's restaurant. One is identified as a 259-unit Dual-Branded Hotel, and the second is a smaller, boutique hotel with less than a dozen rooms.

All in all, the projects are expected to add roughly between 8,000 and 10,000 residents to the area when finished.

McDonald told PCB Life he and his company are well aware of the boom in development throughout the greater PCB area, which is occurring elsewhere throughout the Florida Panhandle. Oldacre McDonald recently redeveloped the Just Jump Shopping Center on Hutchinson Boulevard and previously helped build the west end Winn-Dixie at 23200 Front Beach Road. "We're excited to have broken ground with this project," McDonald said. "It's great to be back at the same intersection."

Let's Get Growing with Julie:

Reindeer Moss

As the weather cools off many people take to the trails to explore beautiful Northwest Florida beyond the beaches. If

you find yourself hiking through state parks, national parks, or other undeveloped natural areas you will likely spot common native plants including oaks, pines, palmetto, and goldenrod. But as

you are walking, be sure to take notice of the area beneath the trees and shrubs or you might walk right past a patch of reindeer moss!

Reindeer moss forms masses of small lacey looking graygreen balls that live on top of sandy soil in undisturbed areas. Technically a lichen, reindeer moss is composed of a mutualistic relationship between a fungus and a blue-green algae and has no roots. The fungus provides structure and form to the lichen and the algae makes food through photosynthesis. Reproducing by spores, reindeer moss can cover large bare areas of full to part sun in the forest. Upon close inspection you will notice intricately formed rounded balls that remind me of snowballs each with unique branching de-

So, you might be wondering why is it called reindeer moss?

Reindeer moss belongs to the genus Cladonia which occurs from Florida to the arctic tundra and is a winter food source for – you guessed it – reindeer! Although we don't have reindeer in Florida, reindeer lichen may be a food source for native white-tailed deer and is utilized by native birds for nesting material as well as a food source for

Sergey Bogza's Journey to Panama City:

A Symphony of Fate

Interview with Marta Rose-Thorpe

Sergey Bogza, the charismatic Music Director and Conductor of the Panama City Symphony arrived in Florida three years ago with a journey that started thousands of miles away, winding through Oregon, Illinois, and thirty-eight U.S. states—plus a few jaunts to Canada. Accompanied by his two loyal Belgian Malinois, Samson and Stella, he explored much of the country during the pandemic. "Travel was unexpectedly affordable," Sergey recalls, "so instead of staying put, I packed up, booked some dog-friendly hotels and Airbnbs, and hit the road." His travels eventually brought him to Florida, where he spent three weeks exploring Tallahassee. Before leaving, he couldn't resist a final stop: Panama City Beach, a place he'd heard so much about.

When I first visited, I had no idea Panama City Beach had a symphony," Sergey admits. "I thought, wouldn't it be amazing to live here one day?" He left town, but the notion lingered. Just a few months later, the Panama City Symphony posted an opening for Music Director, and fate seemed to call him back. "It felt serendipitous. Conducting positions like this one are rare two or three open across the country in any given year. So, being offered the position was a genuine honor. It was a musical lottery win—finding a role that aligns with my vision and values, in a community that shares those values." Panama City felt like a place where he could not only make music but also lay down roots.

An Artistic Renaissance in Panama City

Sergey sees the spirit of renewal everywhere in Panama City, especially in its vibrant arts scene. "There's such a feeling of renaissance here," he says. "Every time you leave for a few weeks and return, something new has sprung up—a new restaurant, a freshly paved street, a building rising. There's a sense of growth that's exciting and inspiring, for both the arts and the people who call this place home." Panama City



is transforming, and it's clear that Sergey finds his role in its cultural revival immensely fulfilling. "The energy here is like nowhere else. The community is truly on the same wavelength, and I feel that they're open to what we're creating together with the symphony."

A Christmas of Simple Joys

When asked about Christmas, Sergey's eyes light up, revealing cherished memories of holiday seasons in the small village on the Russia-Ukraine border where he grew up. His family, though modest in means, infused every holiday with magic. "We didn't have much, so Christmas was all about simplicity," he remembers fondly. "We'd cut down a fresh tree from the woods, and as the eldest, it was my job to carry it home. The cold was intense, freezing your nose and fingers, but the smell of that tree made it all worth it. Every decoration we had was handmade, every meal homemade. The only music we could hear was what we made ourselves-my dad playing guitar, our family singing. It was a Christmas you couldn't buy; you had to create it." For Sergey, one of the most special parts of those childhood Christmases was the caroling. "In a village of only two thousand people, the local musicians and church choir would go house to house, singing in harmony. It was beautifully primitive, a pure joy that's hard to recreate."

Recreating Tradition in Modern Times

Although Christmas is different now, Sergey makes a point each year to capture that same purity. With a growing family of nieces and nephews, there are now many holiday gatherings, yet he finds himself drawn to moments of simplicity. "I pick one day during the season to shut off technology, make a homemade meal, and listen to Bach's Christmas Oratorio. That's as close as I can get to the magic I remember." As a conductor, Sergey understands the unique joys and sacrifices that come with his role. Holidays for him now mean preparing concerts that will bring together



families and friends in Panama City. "Being a musician, you're often away from your own family during the holidays, creating the Christmas spirit for others instead," he says thoughtfully. "If I were to leave and visit my family in Oregon, I'd miss the chance to perform for the families here who look forward to our concerts."

For Sergey, this season is a time of happiness, but it's also bittersweet. "It's a beautiful exchange. Though I may miss my own family's celebrations, seeing the joy and magic our performances bring to people here is deeply rewarding. Sharing music is what I love, and I get to share it with a community

that appreciates every note." With his incredible journey, his passion for the arts, and his love for his new community, Sergey Bogza has found in Panama City a place where music, tradition, and community come together in perfect harmony.







Common Dermatology Myths Busted

1. That clear bump on my face could not be skin cancer. It does not even have color!

Many basal cell cancers present as a clear bump that looks very subtle at first. Eventually, it will start bleeding easily and that is what usually prompts people to see their dermatologist.

2. I am only 25 years old. People don't get skin cancers until they are in their 60s and 70s.

Although it is true that the chance of getting skin cancer increases with age, unfortunately, it can occasionally happen in young people.

3. I don't need to wear sunscreen in the winter or on cloudy days.

Sunscreen is recommended daily year-round. Many skin cancers are caused by daily sun exposure over our whole life. Up to 90% of UV rays can pass through cloud cover.

4. My hormone therapy is not contributing to my acne or hair loss.

A number of hormones can stimulate adult onset acne and pattern hair loss, especially testosterone. Many patients are taking supplements that can be appropriate for certain conditions. However, I often see patients with levels of testosterone much higher than recommended and this can trigger both acne and hair loss.

5. As a woman, it is completely normal to have dryness of the vaginal muco-



sa, itching and pain during sex. This is just part of menopause and getting older.

There are so many things that come with getting older and menopause but I am shocked at how many women I diagnose with lichen sclerosus which is an autoimmune disease that causes itching, pain, and burning and can even make it impossible to have sex in severe cases. For some reason, this is hugely underdiagnosed. I even see OBGYNs who miss it or do not diagnose it all of the time. This leads to misdiagnosis and

women thinking they are crazy for years before they get an accurate diagnosis. It is treatable and much better if caught early!

6. I can see all of my spots and none of them have changed so I will just get checked if I see something new.

It is impossible to see all of your skin. It is very hard to see certain areas even with a mirror like your back and your scalp. Also, most importantly, the spots patients come in worried about are often harmless. Many times, I identify a suspicious skin cancer that the patient had no idea was there.

7. I will call my dermatologist right away if anything is hurting or itching.

Most skin cancers are completely asymptomatic and most people are not aware that they are there.

volvement (I had to do a lot of running around rather than just order something online).


Although my husband received other more expensive gifts last year, the repaired readers were his favorite because they communicated to him the lengths I would go to make him happy. In turn, he was happy with me.

Book Review: Big Magic


Creative Living Beyond Fear by Elizabeth Gilbert



Rosacea: Causes, Triggers, and Treatment Options

There are some daily practices and products to include and exclude from your routine to prevent rosacea from getting worse. For your face wash, use a gentle cleanser and avoid exfoliants. Avoid extremes of temperatures when washing your face - not too hot or cold - lukewarm water is best. Apply sunscreen in the morning to avoid sun damage and further inflammation.

There are a myriad of different treatment options depending on the type of rosacea that you have. Some of these options include prescription creams, antibiotics, oral laser treatments, and surgical excision. Please speak to your medical provider for the best treatment options for your type of rosacea.

But going to a Waffle House with a blind child is another matter entirely. The whole ordeal is different. For starters, the multisensory experience begins with the nose.

"That smell," the child said, as we walked into the door.

She used her white cane to trace the perimeter of the aisle, navigating between booth and bar and jukebox.

"What is that smell?" she said. Nose to the ceiling.

"It's bacon," said my wife.

When you walk into a Waffle House, it's the smell that gets you first. The smell of cured pork and frying tuber vegetables. It hits you in the back of the throat. If you're lucky, the scent works its way into the fibers of your clothes. And it stays with you all day.

The child was smiling. "This place smells delicious."

"Welcome to Waffle House," said the server.

We told the waitress it was the kid's first time visiting.

The employees made a big deal about it. You would have thought Young Harry and Meghan Markle were entering the premises.

We sat. We talked. The waitress gave the kid a complimentary paper hat.

I've known people who worked at Waffle House. The industry term for this hat is the Confidence Killer. But it looked good on the girl.

The waitress gave me a paper hat too. She put it on my head. I looked like an unhappy mess-hall sergeant.

The child is thrilled to be here and she doesn't care who knows. She is dancing in her seat. Bouncing in rhythm to the jukebox music. Which is Taylor Swift.

"Are you having a good day" says our waitress.

"Yes, we are!!" says the kid, using not one but two exclamation points.

She ordered eggs, scrambled. Bacon, crispy. White toast, buttered within an inch of its grain. Strawberry jam. An Irish pint of chocolate milk. A giant waffle—blueberry.

The waitress drew a whippedcream smiley face on the waffle. Nobody asked her to do that.

When the meal was finished, the waitresses asked, "Has it been a good first visit to Waffle House?"

But the kid can't answer. Her mouth is still full.

So the waitresses offered to pose for a picture with us, to commemorate the monumental occasion. One that will not soon be forgotten.

We all pose. The photographer holds the camera and tells us all to smile. "Say cheese," says the photographer.

"No," says one waitress, kissing the blind girl's head. "Don't say cheese. On the count of three, let's everyone say, 'Love!'"

Whereupon every customer joined in unison, counting down with the photographer. We all counted.

"ONE...! TWO...!" Love.



BCSO Issues Scam Alert

Bay County Sheriff Tommy Ford recently issued a Scam Alert after receiving several complaints about a new scam using the social media platform Facebook.

In this scam, the scammer hacks a person's Facebook page. Once they have access, the scammer posts a list of valuable items for sale at very low prices. Vehicles, tractors, tools, and other items that, in the pictures, appear to be in good condition and, because of a hardship, are being sold

When a potential victim shows interest in purchasing an item and sends a message to the scammer, they are told that to make a purchase they must use a cash app. If the victim is unsure, they are urged to at least send a substantial deposit to "hold" the item, again, using the cash app. Sometimes the scammer reaches back out to warn the victim that there has been a lot of interest in the item and to continue to hold the item, the victim must show they are serious about the purchase and send another deposit by cash app.

The post is a scam. There are no items for sale at low prices because of a family illness or hardship. Once money is sent through the cash app, the scam is complete. Suddenly, the victim can no longer make contact with the scammer to take possession of the item. They have been scammed.

Sheriff Ford urges anyone attempting to purchase an item listed on a social media post to make every effort to examine the item in person before purchasing. The Bay County Sheriff's Office also offers a Safe Space for transactions to take place in the front parking lot of the main office at 3421 N. Hwy. 77, Panama City.
